Bangladesh Clears Adani Power's Dues

Settlement brings cross-border pact back on track; Dhaka gives sovereign guarantee to firm

Mumbai: Adani Power has received a payment of \$437 million from the Bangladesh government in June—the largest single-month disbursement to date—clearing all outstanding dues for power supplied from its 1,600 MW Godda plant in Jharkhand as of March 31, 2025, sources said. This payment caps off a series of \$90–100 million monthly tranches received over the

last few months to pay off the dues. With all pending payments—including carrying costs and late fees—settled, Adani Power's cross-border power agreement with Bangladesh is now financially and contractually back on track. The Power Purchase Agreement (PPA), which had come under scrutiny from Bangladesh authorities, has been given a clean chit sources said.

The Godda plant supplies around 10% of Bangladesh's electricity needs. As pay-

ment-related issues are now resolved, Bangladesh has asked Adani to operate both 800 MW units in line with the BPDB's power scheduling requirements.

The company had reached an agree-

ment with Bangladesh that if they paid off the previous fiscal dues by June 30, the late payment surcharge will be waived off.

Bangladesh is now making payments on time. To ensure this continues, it has put in place a Letter of Credit (LoC) equal to two months of bills of around \$180 million and a sovereign guarantee for all dues.

In May, ET had reported that Bangladesh's dues to Adani stood at around \$900 million.

Adani Power CFO Dilip Jha had told analysts that the total billing to Bangladesh stood at \$2 billion, of which \$1.2 billion had been received by the end of FY25, with an additional \$136 million billed as late payment surcharge.

Adani Power CEO S B Khyalia had then said the company has continued uninterrupted supply to Bangladesh and that current payments exceed monthly billing.

Adani Properties Gets NCLT Nod to Acquire HDIL's Two Assets

Mumbai: The National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) has approved Adani Properties' acquisition of two assets of defunct real estate developer Housing Development and Infrastructure Ltd (HDIL) through the corporate insolvency resolution process (CIRP).

The assets include a commercial property known as 'Inspire BKC' in Mumbai's business district Bandra-Kurla Complex and a land parcel in Kalyan Shahad on the outskirts of Mumbai.

Adani Properties was found to be the only bidder to make Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC)-compliant proposal for both the properties.

For the Inspire BKC commercial project, its resolution plan is valued at ₹3 crore. This includes ₹2.85 crore allocated to creditors and ₹15 lakh for CIRP costs. In the case of Shahad land parcel, the fair value and liquidation value were estimated at ₹89.66 crore and ₹62.76 crore, respectively.

According to industry experts, both these assets in central Mumbai and Kalyan together are estimated to be valued at over ₹2,000 crore.

How Personal Connect, Family Legacy Helped Get Akzo Nobel

Unfazed by late 'twist in the tale', Parth Jindal took up the challenge head-on to seal a transformative deal for JSW

Mumbai: Sometime around mid-May, a confident Parth Jindal was just about to pop the champagne he had just received as a gift from a senior official, almost certain that he had outbid competition to snap up his biggest prize to date—the India business of Dutch major Akzo Nobel NV. A sudden message from the same official, also in the thick of the deal, threw him off kilter within 24 hours.

A revised counter, higher in value than JSW by around 7-8%, was sent directly to the supervisory board of Akzo Nobel NV in Amsterdam by the consortium of PE group Advent International and Indigo Paints, the other serious contender. Jindal, by then, already had improved his initial binding offer and was in pole position.

The board was also made aware of the Supreme Court's decision from earlier that month rejecting the ₹19,700 crore resolution plan submitted by JSW Steel for Bhushan Power and Steel (BPSL) in 2019 and directed the initiation of liquidation proceedings. Suddenly what seemed like a slam dunk was not so straightforward for both Jindal and his counterpart Greg Poux-Guillaume, CEO, Akzo Nobel NV.

ET spoke to multiple people to piece together how Jindal came from behind to snap up the business, as twists and turns and backroom negotiations made the paints M&A even more colourful than it seemed on canvas. Several spoke off the record as the negotiations were in private domain.

An Indophile, Guillaume was very familiar with the Jindal family and their businesses. In his earlier stints in the power grid and industrial air pollution sectors with Sulzer, GE-Alstom Grid Solutions Business, he dealt and even visited JSW Steel's flagship Vijayanagar plant as a key supplier.

There was also another connection: Between 2009 and 2011, Guillaume had also spent time in private equity at CVC Capital Partners as a senior MD. The son of CVC's co-founder Rolly van Rappard was Parth's roommate for two years at Harvard Business School. "So when he did a reference check on us, he heard things from him as well," Jindal told ET.

family. There are a few successful Indian industrial families that are true entrepreneurs and stand out for having the same values," said Guillaume. "It's not just business acumen."

But when a board-run MNC has decided to exit a market as part of a global portfolio rejig, no professional CEO can ride roughshod over the board and ignore the best price on the table. "Value is important since we have a fiduciary duty to our shareholders to extract the best value out of this transaction, but finding the right home for the business and having the right long-term partner is also invaluable," he added.

"There is no choice," Jindal said during WEF in Davos. "I have to give everything I've got for Akzo Nobel India."

Four months down the line, it was tough to step away so late in the game. JSW Paints' offer was in fact the lowest after the non-binding stage was over in January. Both Pidilite Industries and Advent-Indigo made higher offers. So from get-go, it was time to crank up.

From Geneva, Jindal flew directly to Amsterdam to meet the Akzo top brass, especially Guillaume. "From Holcim days (which JSW Group lost to Adani), I have learnt it's important to strike a rapport with the international management," quipped Jindal. "Not that they would share anything extra in the middle of a transaction but chemistry is equally important. Much to my surprise, Guillaume was very familiar with our family. The moment I entered the room, he asked if I was the son of Sajjan, Navin or Ratan... (Parth's uncles are Navin and Ratan Jindal)."

That bond got stronger when Guillaume visited India and met the team at JSW and even visited the Jindal residence to share a meal with the entire family, including group Chairman Sajjan Jindal and wife Sangita.

With competition intensifying, advertising and marketing (A&M) spends have gone up across the industry, squeezing margins.

But now the joint budgets of around ₹350 crore will be at his disposal.

Akzo is also relinquishing the 3.5% royalty or ₹80 crores that it charged from its Indian arm for decorative paints giving additional firepower to Jindal to take on larger incumbents Asian Paints or newcomer Birla Opus, both of whom is estimated to have spent ₹450 crores on A&M alone.

Jindal is willing to absorb the "pain" in the decorative segment for the next 2-3 years. "We are willing to even put a ₹100 crore extra from our side to be in the top 3 in the share of voice," he said.

But the real game will be the industrial segment where Kansai Nerolac has strong links with Korean and Japanese steel and auto OEMs. "We want to become the number one in industrial. We believe that with the technology of Akzo International, which we still have access to post this transaction, we will have a real shot at scaling up the industrial franchise and double it ₹5000 crore over the next three years."

In all this, Pidilite remained the joker in the pack and were in parallel talks with JSW and Asian Paints and a few others, but they were only keen on the decorative business, leaving out the industrial piece.

Their offer, though much higher than both Advent-Indigo and JSW, was only for a part. "They wanted somebody else to take industrial," said an official. "JSW said in case they lose out, they will re-engage."

That wasn't necessary once Jindal matched the new offer but insisted both sides get into exclusivity by May end. Akzo and its observers were too happy to oblige.

With the June 12 Air India crash stirring public uproar amid scarce post-accident updates, a wave of false information, including pictures and videos created by generative AI, has swarmed the internet.

AI Crash: Simulation Points to Tech Flaw

More than two weeks after the deadly crash of an Air India plane that killed all but one of the 242 people on board, investigators and the airline are studying possible dual engine failure as a scenario that prevented the Boeing 787 jet from staying airborne.

Pilots from the airline reenacted the doomed aircraft's parameters in a flight simulator, including with the landing gear deployed and the wing flaps retracted, and found those settings alone didn't cause a crash, according to people familiar with the investigation.

The result, alongside the previous discovery that an emergency-power turbine deployed seconds before impact, has reinforced the focus on a technical failure as one possible cause, said the people, who asked not to be identified discussing non-public deliberations.

The simulated flight was conducted separately from the official probe being led by India's Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau, or AAIB, and was done to explore possible scenarios, one of the people said.

The Boeing 787 that crashed in Ahmedabad on June 12 was powered by two engines made by General Electric. Video footage of the aircraft showed the plane struggling to gain altitude after taking off, and then sinking back to the ground, where it exploded.

ADDITIONAL CLUES

Boeing declined to comment and deferred any questions to AAIB while GE said it cannot comment on an active investigation. The AAIB and Air India did not respond to a request for comment. Whether or why both engines would have simultaneously lost power remains unknown, but investigators will seek additional clues from the two flight recorders, whose data has been extracted and is undergoing analysis. The investigation is exploring a wide range of scenarios, though a closer focus is on technical issues, the people said.

Pilots who reviewed the footage have pointed to the fact that the landing gear was already partially tilted forward, suggesting the cockpit crew had initiated the retraction sequence of the wheels.

Mumbai: Adani Power received \$437 million from the Bangladesh government in June, clearing that country's payment arrears to the Indian company for electricity supplied till March 31, people in the know said.

The last payment was the largest instalment that Adani Power received for the power supplied from its 1,600 MW Godda plant in Jharkhand to Bangladesh. Previous payments had been \$90-100 million a month.

With all pending payments, including carrying costs and late fees, settled, Adani Power's cross-border power agreement with Bangladesh is now financially and contractually back on track, the people said. The power purchase agreement, which had come under scrutiny from Bangladesh authorities, has been given a clean chit, they said.

The Godda plant supplies around 10% of Bangladesh's electricity needs. As payment-related issues are now resolved, Dhaka has asked Adani to operate both 800 MW units at the facility in line with the Bangladesh Power Development Board's power scheduling requirements.

The company had reached an agreement with Bangladesh that if that country cleared the previous fiscal year's dues by June 30, the late payment surcharge would be wai-

ved. Bangladesh is now making payments on time. To ensure this continues, it has put in place a letter of credit equal to two months of bills of around \$180 million and a sovereign guarantee for all dues.

In May, ET reported that Bangladesh's dues to Adani Power stood at around \$900 million. Adani Power chief financial officer Dilip Jha at the time told analysts that the total billing to Bangladesh stood at \$2 billion, of which \$1.2 billion had been received by the end of FY25, with an additional \$136 million billed as late payment surcharge.

Adani Power, however, has continued uninterrupted supply to Bangladesh, chief executive SB Khyalia had said. In the January-March quarter, dues declined by ₹500 crore.

The contract's reaffirmation has also resulted in structural changes on the Indian side. The Godda project, previously housed in a separate subsidiary, has been merged with Adani Power for operational and financial streamlining. This integration, combined with the resolution of dues, may help upgrade the company's credit rating from AA to AA+, which could lower future cost of funds.

Adani Power has a ₹1.2 lakh crore capital expenditure plan over the next six years to expand its generation capacity from the current 17.55 GW to 30.67 GW by 2030. This would mark the largest capacity addition in India's private sector thermal power segment. The company has placed advanced equipment orders for 11.2 GW of ultra-supercritical boilers, turbines and generators to secure its supply chain.

The assets include a commercial property known as 'Inspire BKC' in Mumbai's business district Bandra-Kurla Complex and a land parcel in Kalyan Shahad on the outskirts of Mumbai.

Adani Properties was found to be the only bidder to make Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC)-compliant proposal for both the properties.

For the Inspire BKC commercial project, its resolution plan is valued at ₹3 crore. This includes ₹2.85 crore allocated to creditors and ₹15 lakh for CIRP costs. In the case of Shahad land parcel, the fair value and liquidation value were estimated at ₹89.66 crore and ₹62.76 crore, respectively.

According to industry experts, both these assets in central Mumbai and Kalyan together are estimated to be valued at over ₹2,000 crore.

The Mumbai bench of the NCLT approved the resolution plans for both projects under Section 31 of the IBC, 2016. The committee of creditors (CoC) had cleared both the plans with 66.08% voting share in 2022. The voting concluded in November 2022.

The Rakesh Wadhawan-promoted HDIL has been undergoing insolvency since 2019 with admitted liabilities of over ₹7,789 crore.

While its resolution professional had initially issued an expression of interest for a resolution of the entire company in February 2020, it did not receive any proposal.

As the company had several unfinished residential properties, the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) allowed a project-wise resolution plan.

The CoC had initially rejected this proposal. However, following objections from homebuyers, the committee reversed its stance in September 2021 and authorised the RP to explore project-wise resolution.

In the case of Vertical IX, the Shahad land parcel, Punjab and Maharashtra Cooperative Bank — now Unity Small Finance Bank — is the sole secured creditor holding mortgage rights.

The bank's objections to the valuation were dismissed by the tribunal in July 2024.

Both plans include performance guarantees of ₹5 crore each, as required under the CIRP regulations. ET's query to Adani Group remained unanswered until press time Tuesday.

The tariffs, paused for 90 days to allow for bilateral trade negotiations, have sparked cautious optimism among investors who foresee an extension or a favourable US-India trade deal. The benchmark Nifty 50 index last ended at 25,542, less than 3 per cent below its record closing of 26,179 on September 27, 2024. From this year's low of 22,162 on April 7, the Nifty has rallied more than 15 per cent. Amish Shah, head of India research at BofA Securities, said, "Markets are fully pricing in an imminent India-US trade deal, making any delay or disappointment a major risk."

Nimesh Chandan, chief investment officer at Bajaj Finserv Mutual Fund, described the potential for an extension as "kicking the can down the road", as inking trade agreements within a short period is challenging.

He, however, believes India will be the least impacted by US tariffs compared to other nations. Analysts are more sanguine also because of the nature of India's exports to the US, which are predominantly services like information technology and medical services — likely to be exempt from tariffs.

Speeding up trade

Operational gaps in cargo clearance need attention

India in recent years made notable improvements in its logistics ecosystem, driven by advancements in port infrastructure, multimodal connectivity, digital integration, and a renewed emphasis on trade facilitation. The country had climbed six spots on the World Bank's logistics performance index, 2023, moving to 38th position globally. The jump reflects the early impact of initiatives such as the PM Gati Shakti and Unified Logistics Interface Platform. In this regard, the recently released National Time Release Study (NTRS) 2025, conducted by the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs, provides granular data on how long it takes for import and export cargo to be cleared through various Indian ports. Time-bound cargo movement allows exporters, especially small and medium enterprises, to meet global timelines, reduce costs, improve trade competitiveness, and integrate with global value chains.

Trade-facilitation reforms, including digitisation, pre-arrival processing, and the Authorised Economic Operator (AEO) programme, are steadily reducing average release times (ARTs). According to the study, gains were seen at seaports and air-cargo complexes (ACCs), where ARTs fell significantly. Relative to 2024, Inland Container Depots (ICDs) saw marginal improvement, while Integrated Check Posts (ICPs) continued to outperform all categories, with nearly 93 per cent of imports cleared within the NTFAP (National Trade Facilitation Action Plan) benchmark of 48 hours. Exports, however, reveal a mixed picture. The ART for exports, or the duration from cargo arrival to final departure, suggests that while ACCs and ICPs meet most clearance targets, seaports and ICDs continue to lag. This is particularly worrying, given that these locations handle a substantial portion of India's out-bound trade volume. Differences in cargo type, stuffing method, and time-of-day patterns cause further variations in release time.

What drags performance down? The study flags delays in duty payment, frequent amendments to shipping and entry documents, and inefficient query resolution as key contributors to higher clearance times. MORE THAN TWO weeks after the deadly crash of an Air India plane that killed all but one of the 242 people on board, investigators and the airline are studying possible dual engine failure as a scenario that prevented the Boeing 787 jet from staying airborne.

Pilots from the airline reenacted the doomed aircraft's parameters in a flight simulator, including with the landing gear deployed and the wing flaps retracted, and found those settings alone didn't cause a crash, according to people familiar with the investigation.

The result, alongside the previous discovery that an emergency-power turbine deployed seconds before impact, has reinforced the focus on a technical failure as one possible cause, said the people, who asked not to be identified discussing non-public deliberations.

The simulated flight was conducted separately from the official probe being led by India's Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB) and was done to explore possible scenarios, one

of the people said.

The Boeing 787 that crashed in Ahmedabad on June 12 was powered by two engines made by General Electric. Video footage of the aircraft showed the plane struggling to gain altitude after taking off, and then sinking back to the ground, where it exploded.

Boeing declined to comment and deferred any questions to

AAIB, while GE said it cannot comment on an active investigation. The AAIB and Air India did not respond to a request for comment.

Whether or why both engines would have simultaneously lost power remains unknown, but investigators will seek additional clues from the two flight recorders, whose data has been extracted and is undergoing

analysis. The investigation is exploring a wide range of scenarios, though a closer focus is on technical issues, the people said.

Pilots who reviewed the footage have pointed to the fact that the landing gear was already partially tilted forward, suggesting the cockpit crew had initiated the retraction sequence of the wheels.

Adani Logistics Ltd (ALL) has launched its first double stack rake service, connecting the inland container depot (ICD) Tumb in Vapi (Gujarat) to the ICD Patli in Haryana. According to Adani, this marks a significant milestone in India's journey toward high efficiency, sustainable logistics and positions Adani Logistics at the forefront of multimodal infrastructure innovation. The double stack rake -- essentially two layers of containers stacked one above the other -- dramatically increases the volume of cargo transported per trip. This not only boosts operational efficiency but also reduces trans-



it time, carbon footprint, and logistics costs for clients operating between the manufacturing hubs of Vapi, Silvassa, and Daman and the consumption centres of Delhi-National Capital Region (NCR), Haryana, and Punjab. A senior Adani Logistics official said, "This is not just about moving containers; it's about accelerating India's supply chain advantage. With double-stack rail, we can serve clients faster, greener, and more cost-effectively." The strategic link between ICD Tumb and ICD Patli is expected to decongest road freight, cut emissions by up to 30 per cent per container, and streamline export-import traffic through western ports such as Mundra and Hazira in Gujarat. For industries in southern Gu-

jarat and North India -- especially textiles, pharmaceuticals, electronics, and chemicals -- this corridor offers unmatched speed, reliability, and scalability. The result, alongside the previous discovery that an emergency-power turbine deployed seconds before impact, has reinforced the focus on a technical failure as one possible cause.

The simulated flight was conducted separately from the official probe being led by

India's Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau.

The plane was powered by two engines made by General Electric Co. Video footage of the aircraft showed it struggling to gain altitude after tak-

Whether or why both engines would have simultaneously lost power remains unknown, but investigators will seek additional clues from the two flight recorders, whose data has been extracted and is undergoing analysis. The investigation is exploring a wide range of scenarios, though a closer focus is on technical issues, the people said. Pilots who reviewed the footage have pointed to the fact that the landing gear was already

partially tilted forward, suggesting the cockpit crew had initiated the retraction sequence of the wheels.

At the same time, the landing-gear doors had not opened, which pilots say might mean that the aircraft experienced a loss of power or a hydraulic failure — again pointing to possible issues with the engines that provide the aircraft's electricity. The engines of modern aircraft are computer controlled using a system called Full Authority Digital Engine Control (FADEC) which helps pilots control

an aircraft's power and makes sure the engines are used efficiently and not outside their operating limits.

An emergency turbine called the RAT, which deploys from the back of the aircraft in the case of electrical failure, was activated before the plane crashed, as per previous findings. That fan helps provide the aircraft with vital power, though it's far too small to generate any lift.

Analysis of the crash wreckage suggests that the wing flaps and slats, which help an aircraft increase lift

during takeoff, were extended correctly.

The pilots, who died in the crash, sent out a Mayday signal shortly after takeoff. There were only about 15 seconds between the distress call and impact, two people familiar with the probe said. Teams from Boeing and the US National Transportation Safety Board are supporting the investigation on the ground. It's unknown when authorities will give an update from readout of the flight recorders, which provide a comprehensive analysis.

In the wake of tragic Dreamliner crash, trauma latches on to flight crew, pilots

In the wake of tragic Dreamliner crash, trauma latches on to flight crew, pilots

The morning of June 13 was one of the most dreaded for a pilot who had recently taken command of the A320 after seven years as co-pilot. As details of the Air India crash came in and theories on the causes did the rounds, not only did he get a sinking feeling when he thought of his forthcoming flight that afternoon, but his wife and ageing mother's incessant replaying of the videos and those 32 seconds before the airplane blew up in flames gave him the jitters. "A lethal combination of awe (that something like this was at all possible), trauma, shock and disbelief (ATSD)", is how he described the feeling.

As he finished lunch in his Gurugram apartment and began to get ready to leave for the airport, his wife and mother surrounded him and urged him to call in sick. They too needed a day or two to absorb the shock of the unreal nightmare that had unfolded on TV, computer and phone screens. The pilot, who asked not to be named finally caved in and called in sick, unaware that he was actually one of many both in his airline and in the rival carriers to have done so. For days after the crash, pilots and cabin crew across the country looked for ways to cope with what may have, prior to June 13, considered a one-in-a-billion event. Almost all domestic airlines saw a few sick call ins, some due to pressure from family members than a case of nerves.

The three "dystopian" days, as many in the sector described them, post the crash, did require some re-rostering and rescheduling on the part of Air India, a spokesperson for the airline confirmed, with a few commanders, first officers and crew calling in sick, although he claimed that things were back to normal by Monday, June 16.

Air India management - which was in a state of shock itself - did put peer counselling into place. AI buddies were available for anyone who felt they needed counsel-

ling to carry out their duties as required and psychologists were available at the main airports for both the employees and regular fliers to avail of their services if need be. In a country where any kind of mental support is frowned upon and perceived as a sign of "madness" if not weakness, how many senior commanders or staff actually availed of these remains opaque. Neither was the effort to support flying staff adequate nor was it very effective, according to sources both in the airline and the sector.

But it wasn't just pilots. Not far from where the pilot lived, a woman fretted as her daughter, studying in the US, boarded an Air India Dreamliner to come back home for the summer. The 21-year-old was flying alone and had, just like the rest of the world, witnessed the horrific accident. The mother, who asked not to be named, knew the chances of a repeat were truly slim but her mind kept playing games and she stayed awake in panic half the night, reaching an hour before arrival to receive her only child at Delhi's T3 terminal. Although she did not take the extreme step of asking her daughter to cancel the trip, many fliers did and platforms across India reported a drop in bookings and some cancellations post the crash in domestic trips, an expected and natural response to a disaster of this magnitude.

When uncertainty kills

While there is a name for the condition, post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), matters are now acquiring a more worrisome nature as the pilots and crew say the uncertainty of not knowing what happened is killing them.

"It's one thing to see an incident like this play out and quite another to have no idea why it occurred (almost three weeks later)", says a senior Indigo commander who asked not to be named. He says he is spooked, especially when he looks at his new-born infant, who is less than six months old. While he has been reporting for duty since the Monday after the crash, he says his mind is not at rest and is "riddled with a million uncertainties". The endless speculation on the cause of the crash has not helped.

While a majority of pilots and crew seem to have found mechanisms to cope, some continue to suffer from the after effects of the trauma, reliving and replaying it in their heads. While the travelling public was spooked too (even though public memory is short) and followed the news and causes of the crash far more closely than most other events, it was those placing themselves daily in the cockpit responsible for many lives that needed -- and still need -- support.

Many commanders now say they feel jittery especially since no clear cause had been announced. More than one expressed the "need for clarity". They also cited pressure from their families, wives, old parents and dependents to go on "long leave". That isn't possible for everyone; in many cases, the pilots are the sole earning members of their family.

As one Bengaluru based commander who recently took command on an A320 Neo put it: "There's more to it than just me and how I am dealing with it. This silence on the possible cause is making things worse: the uncertainty of not knowing what unfolded in those 32 seconds and led to what it did." He says he has called in sick once, after looking at the face of his eight-month-old daughter.

Moreover, he adds, asking not to be named, he keeps replaying what might go wrong even as he enters the cockpit for his next flight and adds that he can almost

hear the collective prayers from the cabins behind. The only consolation factor is that the probability of a similar episode is almost nil. "Dual engine and complete failure of the kind this appears to be can only be a lapse of maintenance or a manufacturing defect," said another commander who asked not to be named, admitting that the probability of a repeat is extremely low.

The pilot cited in the first instance said that while he managed to go to work from the Monday following the crash, it hasn't been easy. Every time he emerges in his uniform, his wife responds by banging doors, his mother sulks and he's greeted by long faces. He says most families of pilots he knows are asking the pilots "to avoid flying till they know more" as they too need some sort of closure. While avoiding flying is certainly not possible for all, the pressure at home is building up and safety has replaced other dinner table conversation, he added.

Other weak spots

A former Indian Airlines senior management member recalls a similar situation playing out post the 1990 Indian Airlines A320 air crash in Bengaluru, which killed 92 people. The A320 had entered commercial service only the year before (1989) and many were not convinced of its operational efficiency and safety features. The government took a decision to ground the aircraft, which was

"economically disastrous" for Indian Airlines at the time but helped reduce anxiety levels among pilots and cabin crew. "Flight safety is not confined to machines. It is all about the confidence levels of the pilots in the cockpit", argued this person, adding that it is incumbent upon the director of flight safety in Air India who would be privy to this crash investigation to allay fears within the crew.

Aviation industry executives say that this crash has exposed the inherent weaknesses in the system especially with regard to emergency response plans. "Although widely advocated by IATA, it seems in the heat of the moment, no systematic emergency response plan appears to have been executed", says a former MOCA secretary. IATA offers a structured emergency planning and response course for airlines and airport staffers as part of its safety management systems. While the former has been attended by 450 participants from 90 countries in the past five years, the latter has been attended by 149 participants from 34 countries. To what extent Indian carriers or airport staff are trained is not clear.

"Such courses and training in a country as widespread as ours remain more on paper and in theory," argues a former DGCA official, adding that coordination at a national level when a crisis erupts tends to remain haphazard.

In a column in the edit pages of this newspaper, this writer suggested setting up a ministry for trauma care to handle accidents precisely of this nature. While a preliminary explanation for the crash has not yet emerged, there has been a very poor emergency response and post crisis handling with authorities at all levels including the office of the director general of civil aviation (DGCA) inadequately equipped, trained and staffed to handle a disaster of this nature. What has played out is inexcusable for a country with the magnitude of ambition India has.

CHANDIGARH : Punjab registered a record 44% year-on-year growth in net goods and services tax (GST) collection for June 2025 and 27.01% growth for the first quarter of the 2025-26 financial year, said finance and taxation minister Harpal Singh Cheema on Tuesday.

Addressing a press conference here, Cheema said that the net GST collection for June 2025 stood at ₹2,379.90 crore, reflecting a revenue growth of ₹732.21 crore over the ₹1,647.69 crore collected in June 2024.

"This follows monthly net growth trends of 15.35% in April and 24.59% in May. During the first quarter, the collection reached ₹6,830.40 crore, even amidst the conflict between India and Pakistan in May 2025, compared to ₹5,377.75 crore during the corresponding period of 2024-25," he said, after facilitating the top five taxpayers of the state, including Ambuja Cement, HPCL-Mittal Energy Limited (HMEL), Samsung India Pvt Ltd, Tata Steel and Dada Motors.

Launching a scathing attack on the previous SAD-BJP and Congress-led governments, Cheema claimed that while they failed to check tax evasion and improve the state's fiscal health, the AAP government has ensured consistent month-on-month and year-on-year growth.

He said the present government registered a GST collection growth rate of 16.25% in financial year (FY) 2022-23, 15.51% in FY 2023-24, and 12.84% in FY 2024-25, with a total collection of ₹62,733 crore in three years.

He said that during the Congress regime from 2018-19 to 2021-22, the state merely collected ₹55,146 crore.

On the recent enforcement activities, Cheema stated that the state intelligence and preventive unit (SIPU) had uncovered a GST fraud syndicate run by an accountant who created and operated 20 fake firms for bogus billing and ITC fraud.

In the wake of tragic Dreamliner crash, trauma latches on to flight crew, pilots

The morning of June 13 was one of the most dreaded for a pilot who had recently taken command of the A320 after seven years as co-pilot. As details of the Air India crash came in and theories on the causes did the rounds, not only did he get a sinking feeling when he thought of his forthcoming flight that afternoon, but his wife and ageing mother's incessant replaying of the videos and those 32 seconds before the airplane blew up in flames gave him the jitters. "A lethal combination of awe (that something like this was at all possible), trauma, shock and disbelief (ATSD)", is how he described the feeling.

As he finished lunch in his Gurugram apartment and began to get ready to leave for the airport, his wife and mother surrounded him and urged him to call in sick. They too needed a day or two to absorb the shock of the unreal nightmare that had unfolded on TV, computer and phone screens. The pilot, who asked not to be named finally caved in and called in sick, unaware that he was actually one of many both in his airline and in the rival carriers to have done so. For days after the crash, pilots and cabin crew across the country looked for ways to cope with what may have, prior to June 13, considered a one-in-a-billion event. Almost all domestic airlines saw a few sick call ins, some due to pressure from family members than a case of nerves.

The three "dystopian" days, as many in the sector described them, post the crash, did require some re-rostering and rescheduling on the part of Air India, a spokesperson for the airline confirmed, with a few commanders, first officers and crew calling in sick, although he claimed that things were back to normal by Monday, June 16.

Air India management - which was in a state of shock itself - did put peer counselling into place. AI buddies were available for anyone who felt they needed counsel-

ling to carry out their duties as required and psychologists were available at the main airports for both the employees and regular fliers to avail of their services if need be. In a country where any kind of mental support is frowned upon and perceived as a sign of "madness" if not weakness, how many senior commanders or staff actually availed of these remains opaque. Neither was the effort to support flying staff adequate nor was it very effective, according to sources both in the airline and the sector.

But it wasn't just pilots. Not far from where the pilot lived, a woman fretted as her daughter, studying in the US, boarded an Air India Dreamliner to come back home for the summer. The 21-year-old was flying alone and had, just like the rest of the world, witnessed the horrific accident. The mother, who asked not to be named, knew the chances of a repeat were truly slim but her mind kept playing games and she stayed awake in panic half the night, reaching an hour before arrival to receive her only child at Delhi's T3 terminal. Although she did not take the extreme step of asking her daughter to cancel the trip, many fliers did and platforms across India reported a drop in bookings and some cancellations post the crash in domestic trips, an expected and natural response to a disaster of this magnitude.

When uncertainty kills

While there is a name for the condition, post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), matters are now acquiring a more worrisome nature as the pilots and crew say the uncertainty of not knowing what happened is killing them.

"It's one thing to see an incident like this play out and quite another to have no idea why it occurred (almost three weeks later)", says a senior Indigo commander who asked not to be named. He says he is spooked, especially when he looks at his new-born infant, who is less than six months old. While he has been reporting for duty since the Monday after the crash, he says his mind is not at rest and is "riddled with a million uncertainties". The endless speculation on the cause of the crash has not helped.

While a majority of pilots and crew seem to have found mechanisms to cope, some continue to suffer from the after effects of the trauma, reliving and replaying it in their heads. While the travelling public was spooked too (even though public memory is short) and followed the news and causes of the crash far more closely than most other events, it was those placing themselves daily in the cockpit responsible for many lives that needed -- and still need -- support.

Many commanders now say they feel jittery especially since no clear cause had been announced. More than one expressed the "need for clarity". They also cited pressure from their families, wives, old parents and dependents to go on "long leave". That isn't possible for everyone; in many cases, the pilots are the sole earning members of their family.

As one Bengaluru based commander who recently took command on an A320 Neo put it: "There's more to it than just me and how I am dealing with it. This silence on the possible cause is making things worse: the uncertainty of not knowing what unfolded in those 32 seconds and led to what it did." He says he has called in sick once, after looking at the face of his eight-month-old daughter.

Moreover, he adds, asking not to be named, he keeps replaying what might go wrong even as he enters the cockpit for his next flight and adds that he can almost

hear the collective prayers from the cabins behind. The only consolation factor is that the probability of a similar episode is almost nil. "Dual engine and complete failure of the kind this appears to be can only be a lapse of maintenance or a manufacturing defect," said another commander who asked not to be named, admitting that the probability of a repeat is extremely low.

The pilot cited in the first instance said that while he managed to go to work from the Monday following the crash, it hasn't been easy. Every time he emerges in his uniform, his wife responds by banging doors, his mother sulks and he's greeted by long faces. He says most families of pilots he knows are asking the pilots "to avoid flying till they know more" as they too need some sort of closure. While avoiding flying is certainly not possible for all, the pressure at home is building up and safety has replaced other dinner table conversation, he added.

Other weak spots

A former Indian Airlines senior management member recalls a similar situation playing out post the 1990 Indian Airlines A320 air crash in Bengaluru, which killed 92 people. The A320 had entered commercial service only the year before (1989) and many were not convinced of its operational efficiency and safety features. The government took a decision to ground the aircraft, which was

"economically disastrous" for Indian Airlines at the time but helped reduce anxiety levels among pilots and cabin crew. "Flight safety is not confined to machines. It is all about the confidence levels of the pilots in the cockpit", argued this person, adding that it is incumbent upon the director of flight safety in Air India who would be privy to this crash investigation to allay fears within the crew.

Aviation industry executives say that this crash has exposed the inherent weaknesses in the system especially with regard to emergency response plans. "Although widely advocated by IATA, it seems in the heat of the moment, no systematic emergency response plan appears to have been executed", says a former MOCA secretary. IATA offers a structured emergency planning and response course for airlines and airport staffers as part of its safety management systems. While the former has been attended by 450 participants from 90 countries in the past five years, the latter has been attended by 149 participants from 34 countries. To what extent Indian carriers or airport staff are trained is not clear.

"Such courses and training in a country as widespread as ours remain more on paper and in theory," argues a former DGCA official, adding that coordination at a national level when a crisis erupts response tends to remain haphazard.

In a column in the edit pages of this newspaper, this writer suggested setting up a ministry for trauma care to handle accidents precisely of this nature. While a preliminary explanation for the crash has not yet emerged, there has been a very poor emergency response and post crisis handling with authorities at all levels including the office of the director general of civil aviation (DGCA) inadequately equipped, trained and staffed to handle a disaster of this nature. What has played out is inexcusable for a country with the magnitude of ambition India has.

Bangladesh resolves Adani's power purchase pact

Bangladesh made its single largest payment of \$437 million in June, clearing pending dues, including carrying costs, and issues related to the power purchase agreement, reaffirming the Indian conglomerate's asset as a reliable and cost-competitive power source for meeting the country's growing energy needs, sources said.

Bangladesh is now regular in payments. Additionally, an LC (Letter of Credit) worth about two months of billing and sovereign guarantee for all dues as additional security has been established, sources aware of the matter said.

Since payment-related matters are resolved, Bangladesh has asked Adani Power to supply power from both units as per BPDB (Bangladesh Power Development Board) schedule, they added.

Sources said Bangladesh has resolved Adani Power's dues, including the carrying cost. Over the last 3-4 months, the country has been paying \$90-100 million per month, and in June, it paid \$437 million. The



LCs are worth about two months of billing and sovereign guarantee for all dues, as additional security has put Adani in a very comfortable situation. Concerns raised related to investigations into the PPA by the Bangladesh authorities have been resolved, with no adverse aspects found.

With all these developments, lenders are confident of improving APL's credit rating to AA+ from the current AA.

Adani Power supplies electricity to Bangladesh from a dedicated 1,600 MW plant located in Godda district of Jharkhand, meeting 10 per cent of the country's power demand. The company sup-

plies among the most competitively priced power to Bangladesh, as is evident from BPDB's merit order dispatch data, which is an essential requirement.

Bangladesh had in the past struggled to meet its payment obligations under the 2017 deal, as rising import costs — following the Russia-Ukraine conflict in 2022 and domestic political turmoil, which led to the ouster of the prime minister — strained the country's finances. As a result, Adani halved its supply last year, and full supplies were resumed in March 2025 after the country's monthly payments started covering some of the dues.

Sources said over the last three to four months, Bangladesh had started paying \$90-100 million per month, and in June, the company received the single largest chunk of payment of \$437 million, thereby clearing all dues. Adani Power's Godda unit was housed under a separate subsidiary, which has now been merged with the parent, providing greater operational and financial synergy. With all these developments, lenders are confident of improving Adani Power's credit rating to AA+ from the current AA, which will further bring down its cost of funds.

The current developments vindicate the contract established between the Bangladesh Government and Adani Power. The Godda asset is now well integrated into the Bangladesh Power system successfully.

Under the 2017 deal, Adani Power's Godda power plant in Jharkhand was to supply 100 per cent of the electricity generated from burning coal to Bangladesh for a period of 25 years. After payment defaults, Adani had cut supplies by half in November 2024. It restored full electricity supply,

which is around 1,600 MW, in March after the country reduced its liabilities.

Bangladesh stepped up repayments from July last year, clearing monthly dues. The development comes after the country suffered from increased power shortages in rural areas.

It has been struggling to generate sufficient dollar revenues to cover the cost of essential imports like electricity, coal, and oil. Its foreign currency reserves declined amid months of student-led protests and political unrest, which culminated in the ousting of the Sheikh Hasina Government in August 2024.

The interim Government that succeeded her sought an additional \$3 billion loan from the International Monetary Fund (IMF), on top of the existing \$4.7 billion bailout package. Adani's power deal with Bangladesh was one of many under Sheikh Hasina, which the current interim Government has called opaque. Besides Adani Power, other Indian state-owned firms also sell power to Bangladesh, including NTPC Ltd and PTC India Ltd.

"It (the plane crash) was an unfortunate incident. The AAIB has begun a full investigation into it. It is being probed from all angles, including any possible sabotage. The CCTV footage is being reviewed and all angles are being assessed. Several agencies are working on it," he had said.

"It has never happened that both engines have shut down together. Once the (full) probe report comes out, we will be able to ascertain if it was an engine problem or fuel supply issue or why both the engines had stopped functioning. There is a Cockpit Voice

Recorder in the black box, which has stored the conversation between the two pilots. It is too early to say anything but whatever it is, it will come out," the minister added.

The Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner, which was operating as Air India flight AI-171 to London, had taken off from Ahmedabad and crashed into the complex of the BJ Medical College — an aerial distance of less than 2 km. The crash took place at 1.39 pm, just 32 seconds after the aircraft took off.

Of the 242 people, including 10 crew members and two pilots, on board the flight, only one — 40-year-old

Vishwash Kumar Ramesh, a British-Indian who was returning to the UK after a visit - survived. At least 30 people on the ground, including trainee doctors, were also killed. The document will focus on establishing a timeline of the crash. It will also detail critical information such as cockpit conversations, pilot actions, system performance, weather data and air traffic control communications, the report added.

While the report is not expected to assign definitive blame, it will mark the first time that investigators publicly share insight into what hap-

pened inside the cockpit and on the ground in the final minutes of the flight.

Meanwhile, legal teams from the US and UK are preparing to sue Air India and Boeing over the devastating Air India crash. The legal action is being considered to seek enhanced compensation for the loss of lives in the tragic incident.

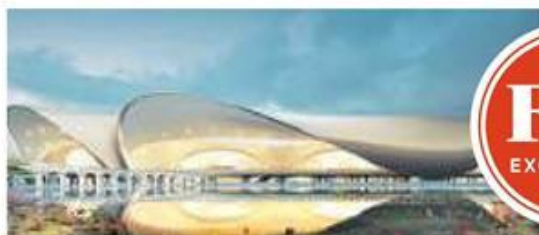

NEW DELHI: Bangladesh made its single largest payment of \$437 million in June, clearing pending dues, including carrying costs, and issues related to the power purchase agreement, reaffirming the Indian conglomerate's asset as a reliable and cost-competitive power source for meeting the country's growing energy needs, sources said.

Bangladesh is now regular in payments. Additionally, an LC (Letter of Credit) worth about two months of billing and sovereign guarantee for all dues as additional security has been established, sources aware of the matter said.

Since payment-related matters are resolved, Bangladesh has asked Adani Power to supply power from both units as per BPDB (Bangladesh Power Development Board) schedule, they added.

Sources said Bangladesh has resolved Adani Power's dues, including the carrying cost. Over the last 3-4 months, the country has been paying \$90-100 million per month, and in June, it paid \$437 million.

The LCs are worth about two months of billing and sovereign guarantee for all dues, as additional security has put Adani in a very comfortable situation.

Concerns raised related to investigations into the PPA by the Bangladesh authorities have been resolved, with no adverse aspects found.

With all these developments, lenders are confident of improving APL's credit rating

Adani Power supplies electricity to Bangladesh from a dedicated 1600 MW plant located in Godda district of Jharkhand, meeting 10 per cent of the country's power demand. The company supplies among the most competitively priced power to Bangladesh, as is evident from BPDB's merit order dispatch data, which is an essential requirement.

Bangladesh had in the past struggled to meet its payment obligations under the 2017 deal, as rising import costs — following the Russia-Ukraine conflict in 2022 and domestic political turmoil, which led to the ouster of the prime minister — strained the country's finances.

As a result, Adani halved its supply last year, and full supplies were resumed in March 2025 after the country's monthly payments started cov-

ering some of the dues.

Sources said over the last three to four months, Bangladesh had started paying \$90-100 million per month, and in June, the company received the single largest chunk of payment of \$437 million, thereby clearing all dues.

Adani Power's Godda unit was housed under a separate subsidiary, which has now been merged with the parent, providing greater operational and financial synergy. With all these developments, lenders are confident of improving Adani Power's credit rating to AA+ from the current AA, which will further bring down its cost of funds.

The current developments vindicate the contract established between the Bangladesh government and Adani Power. The Godda asset is now well integrated into the Bangladesh Power system successfully.

Under the 2017 deal, Adani Power's Godda power plant in Jharkhand was to supply 100 per cent of the electricity generated from burning coal to Bangladesh for a period of 25 years.

After payment defaults, Adani had cut supplies by half in November 2024. It restored full electricity supply, which is around 1,600 MW, in March after the country reduced its liabilities.

Bangladesh stepped up repayments from July last year, clearing monthly dues. The development comes after the country suffered from increased power shortages in rural areas.

Kolkata Port to boost container handling with new mobile cranes

KOLKATA: Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port, Kolkata (SMPK) has announced a major capacity boost at its container terminal with the deployment of two new high-capacity mobile harbour cranes (MHCs) at the Netaji Subhas Dock (NSD), part of the Kolkata Dock System (KDS).

An issued statement read that this move will raise the total number of MHCs at KDS to six, significantly enhancing operational efficiency and reducing vessel turnaround time.

The two cranes, to be deployed by Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone (APSEZ), are powered by electricity—marking a shift towards greener, more sustainable port operations. As part of this eco-conscious initiative, SMPK is also setting up high-capacity electric power supply infrastructure within the dock premises to support the functioning of these cranes.

Rathendra Raman, chairman of SMP Kolkata, described the upgrade as a “paradigm shift” in operational strategy. “The deployment of these

energy-efficient, electric mobile harbour cranes represents a signifi-

cant leap towards sustainable port operations,” he said. He added that the move will play a critical role in strengthening Kolkata’s position as a major container-handling hub on India’s eastern seaboard.

The additional MHCs are expected to increase KDS’s annual container handling capacity to 7.5 lakh Twenty-foot Equivalent Units (TEU) in FY 2025-26. In comparison, KDS handled 6.19 lakh TEUs during FY 2024–25.

Raman extended his gratitude to the APSEZ team in Kolkata and

acknowledged the contributions of SMPK employees who have worked diligently to make this development possible. “This is a remarkable step forward and I appreciate my colleagues who have been tirelessly working towards the port’s progression,” he said.

The commissioning of the two cranes is expected in the coming months. Once operational, they will not only improve the overall productivity of NSD but also reinforce SMP Kolkata’s role as a key gateway for maritime trade in the eastern region.

Calcutta: Two Boeing aircraft, operated by Air India, are stranded at Calcutta Airport because of technical snags.

One of them, a San Francisco-Mumbai flight that had developed a technical snag before takeoff, has been stranded since June 17.

The other on, a Tokyo-Delhi flight which was diverted to Calcutta on Sunday afternoon, is also parked at Calcutta airport.

According to airport officials, it was unusual for an aircraft that developed a technical snag to remain stranded for two weeks.

"Usually, it takes four to

five days for an airline to repair the stranded aircraft and reinstate it into the fleet for operation, unless there is a major problem. Even if the spare parts need to be flown in from the manufacturer's base in the US or Europe, it does not take more than a week for the repair," said an official at the Calcutta airport.

Sources said that after the June 12 crash of Air India's Ahmedabad-London flight seconds after takeoff, the airline's Dreamliner series aircraft are undergoing stringent checks along with other planes in the fleet.

"This could be the reason for the delay in the repair of the aircraft stranded at Calcutta airport since June 17,"

said an official of the civil aviation ministry.

Air India sources said the airline has 33 Dreamliner series aircraft, which had to undergo one-time checks after the crash, overseen by the directorate general of civil aviation (DGCA). Now, 29 aircraft have completed the checks while four are undergoing routine major maintenance. Once those come back, the aircraft have to undergo similar checks.

These checks and snags, along with flight path diversions to avoid war zones, have forced Air India to cancel many flights on several international routes.

The Air India flight from San Francisco to Mumbai with 228 onboard was grounded at Calcutta airport on June 17 after a technical snag was detected in the Boeing 777-200LR aircraft that had stopped to refuel.

The plane, carrying 211 passengers and 17 crew members, had landed at Calcutta airport at 12.47am. Several passengers of AI180 had alleged that they had to wait inside the aircraft for nearly five hours before being allowed to disembark. They also claimed that there was no proper communication from Air India officials.

Some passengers, who were anxious about flying following the crash of Air India's Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner in Ahmedabad on June 12 that killed 241 onboard, said they were relieved that the snag was detected before the plane took off for Mumbai.

The second Air India aircraft stranded at the airport had landed in Calcutta on June 29.

The flight, a Boeing 787-800 Dreamliner from Tokyo to Delhi carrying 243 passengers, was diverted to the Calcutta airport after the air conditioning system malfunctioned, said airport officials.

Passengers were stranded at the Calcutta airport for over eight hours.

The Boeing 777-200 aircraft, stranded since June 17, was first taken to parking stand 115 and later shifted to stand number 12, said airport officials.

The Boeing 787-800 Dreamliner is at parking stand 114, said officials.

Calcutta airport has 76

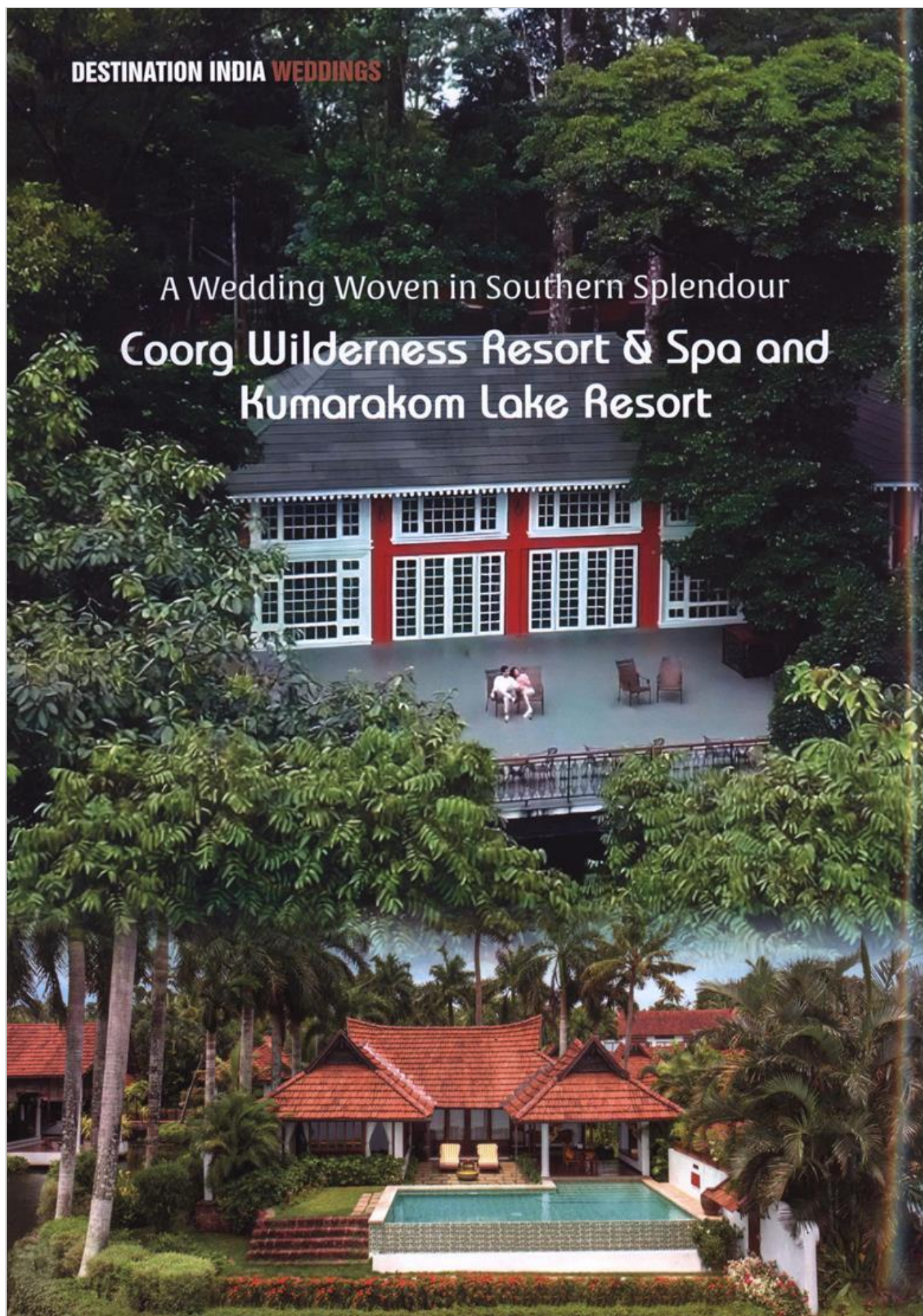

"Flight AI180 operating San Francisco-Mumbai made its scheduled technical stop in Calcutta on 17 June, 2025. During routine checks on the aircraft before departing for Mumbai, an extended maintenance task was advised, which required rectification before the next flight. In the interest of passenger convenience, an alternative aircraft was arranged at the earliest opportunity to fly the passengers to Mumbai on the same evening. The aircraft on the ground will return to service as soon as the maintenance task concludes," said a spokesperson of Air India.

Boeing refused to comment.

"Air India flight crash is under investigation now, and so it is not possible to comment," said a Boeing spokesperson.

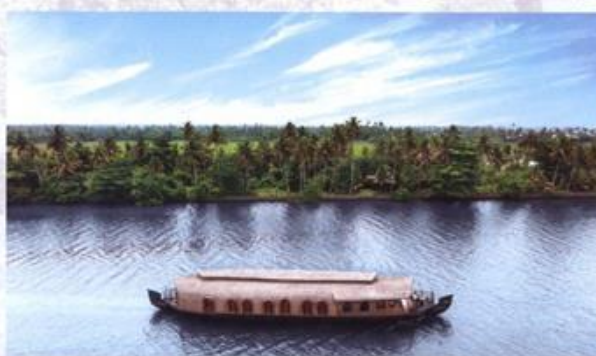

पिछले दिनों अहमदाबाद में जिस प्रकार से एयर इंडिया की फ्लाइट का भयंकर हादसा हुआ, उससे कई सवाल उठ खड़े हुए हैं। सवाल इसलिए भी कि इस प्रकार का हादसा होना नागमकिन जैसा लगता है और इसलिए भी सवाल उठते हैं कि ऐसे दर्दनाक हादसे जब देश में होते हैं, तो उसकी जिम्मेदारी कोई मंत्री या सरकार क्यों नहीं लेती? चाहे वो फ्लाइट हादसा हो, चाहे ट्रेन हादसा हो, चाहे सड़क हादसा हो या फिर चाहे पानी में डूबा कोई बड़ा हादसा हो। सवाल ये भी है कि जब अपनी जेब से एक भी पैसा खर्च किए बिना किसी शिलान्यास से लेकर उद्घाटन तक का श्रेय मंत्री और सरकार लेती है, तो किसी हादसे की जिम्मेदारी आखिर मंत्री या सरकार क्यों नहीं लेते? हद तो तब हो जाती है, जब सरकारी काम को उन पार्टियों के नेता भी चुनावों में भुलाते हैं, जिनकी पार्टी की सरकार में कोई छोटें से छोट्टा भी काम हुआ होता है। जबकि सरकार के पास जो भी पैसा होता है, वो जनता की मेहनत की कमाई में से दिए गए टैक्स का होता है। लेकिन जरा से शिलान्यास पर भी मंत्री, बल्कि आजकल तो सोधे मुख्यमंत्री या प्रधानमंत्री का नाम लिखा जाता है और फोटो छपाया दिया जाता है। जरा-जरा से काम के प्रचार के लिए बड़े-बड़े पोस्टर, बैनर और होर्डिंग लाए जाते हैं। लेकिन जब कोई दर्दनाक हादसा होता है, तो एक चुप्पी साध ली जाती है, जैसे कुछ हुआ ही न हो। जिन कामों का श्रेय लिया जाता है, उसी कामों में कोई खराबी या हादसे के बाद कोई सामने नहीं आता। मसलन, कई पुल, सड़कें और निर्माण उद्घाटन के बाद हो जाते हैं, तो उसकी जिम्मेदारी नहीं ली जाती है।

दरअसल अहमदाबाद के सरदार वल्लभभाई पटेल अंतरराष्ट्रीय हवाई अड्डे से उड़ा एयर इंडिया का एआई 171 नंबर का बोइंग 787-8 ड्रैगमालिनर जहाज मेघानो नगर में सिविल हॉस्पिटल के मेडिकल हॉस्टल से टकराया, उसकी रॉकेट खड़े कर देने वाले वीडियो केन्द्र सरकार को याद दिलाते रहेंगे कि ऐसे हादसे आखिर कब तक होते रहेंगे और सरकार को सवालों के भरे में रखेंगे, भले ही केन्द्र सरकार इस तरह ध्यान दे या न दे। झकझोरने वाले अहमदाबाद में हुए इस जहाज हादसे में उठे सवालों में पहला सवाल तो ये है कि जब जहाज करीब 12 साल पुराना बताया जाता है और उसका इंजन हादसे से तीन महीने पहले ही बदला गया था, फिर ये हादसा कैसे हो गया? और दूसरा सवाल ये है कि दोनों इंजन फेल कैसे हो गए? तीसरा सवाल ये है कि हादसे की जांच के लिए मुख्य जांचकर्ता की नियुक्ति में देरी क्यों की गई? चौथा बड़ा सवाल ये है कि जब ब्लैक बॉक्स मिल गया, तो उसका डेटा निकालने और उसकी जांच में होलाहवाली का क्या मतलब है? पांचवां बड़ा सवाल ये है कि जब जहाज में खराबी आई और पायलट ने मदद मांगी, तो मदद क्यों नहीं मिल सकी या मदद का मौका क्यों नहीं मिला? सवाल तो और भी हैं, लेकिन यह कहना होगा कि इतनी जल्दी हवाई जहाज का हादसा होना किसी के गले नहीं उतर रहा है। हालांकि कुछ रिपोर्टों से ये पता चला है कि जहाज पुराना था और उसमें कई खामियां थीं। अगर ऐसा था, तो फिर बिना रियेयरिंग किए उसकी उड़ान जारी क्यों रखी गई? कहा जा रहा है कि एअर इंडिया के इस जहाज की डिटेल्ड मटेनेंस जांच जून 2023 में भी की गई थी और इस साल यानि 2025 के दिसंबर महीने में इसकी अगली डिटेल्ड मटेनेंस जांच होगी थी। अक्सर देखा जाता है कि जिन मशीनों की कीमत

ज्यादा होती है उसने चलने में रिस्क ज्यादा होता है और उनकी मटेनेंस पर न सिर्फ ज्यादा खर्च किया जाता है, बल्कि उनकी निगरानी भी ज्यादा करने पड़ती है। फ्लाइट यानि हवाई जहाज की यात्रा भी बहुत ज़ोरिख भरी होती है, जिसके चलते उसकी जांच, मटेनेंस, निगरानी और हर जरूरी दिशा-निर्देश का ख्याल रखना होता है। जब कोई जहाज रनवे से उड़ान भरने वाला होता है, तो उससे दो-मंटे पहले ही उसकी फिटनेस चेक होती है, जिससे अगर उसमें कोई कमी हो, तो उसे दूर किया जा सके और उसमें यात्रा करने वाले सही सलामत अपने गंतव्य तक पहुंच सकें। अहमदाबाद में भी एयर इंडिया के इस जहाज की फिटनेस जांच जरूर हुई होगी, तो फिर ऐसा हादसा क्यों हुआ, जिसमें अभी तक 275 लोगों के मारे जाने की पुष्टि हुई है, जबकि अंदेशा है कि मारे गए लोगों की संख्या इससे कहीं



ज्यादा हो सकती है। बहरहाल, हमने देखा है कि सरकार डीज़ल की साल पुरानी और पेट्रोल की 15 साल पुरानी गाड़ियों को हटाने का काम करती है। तो क्या इसी प्रकार जहाजों के चलने की भी कोई समय सीमा निर्धारित है? या उन्हें भी पुरानी ट्रेनों की तरह लगातार इस्तेमाल में लाया जाता है? या जिन पेट्रोल और डीज़ल की गाड़ियों को लोग अपनी मेहनत की कमाई से जैसे-तैसे पैसा जोड़कर खरीदते हैं, सिर्फ उन्हीं पर ही ये फ़ार्मुला लागू है? यहाँ पर एक बहुत बड़ा सवाल ये है कि पुरानी गाड़ियाँ सड़क पर नहीं चल सकती, लेकिन पुराने हवाई जहाजों को आकाश में उड़ाया जाता है, पुरानी ट्रेनों और सरकारी बसों को पटरी और सड़कों पर दौड़ाया जाता है। क्या केन्द्र सरकार की ये दोहरी नीति नहीं है, जो ये जताती है कि सरकार किस प्रकार से बड़ी-बड़ी कंपनियों के फायदे के लिए दबाव में या पार्टी को मिलने वाले चंदे के चक्कर में अपने एजेंडे को साधती है और इस प्रकार के कानून बनाती है जिससे आम आदमी, जिसमें मध्यम वर्ग सबसे ज्यादा प्रताड़ित है, उसकी जेब से लगातार पैसा निकलता रहे और वहीं अमीर यानि पूँजीपतियों की जेब में और सरकार के खजाने में उन्हीं थिप्पी-पिट्टी मशीनों या वाहनों से लगातार पैसा आता रहे, वो भी तब जब हवाई जहाज से लेकर ट्रेनों और सरकारी बसों का किराया लगातार बढ़ा जाता है और उस पर भी टैक्स लिया जाता है। अभी हाल ही में हमारे बीएसएफ के 12 सी जवानों को जिस प्रकार से गिरा से अमरनाथ में ड्यूटी पर जाने के लिए एकदम खराब हालत वाली ट्रेन मुहैया कराई गई थी, जबकि नेताओं के लिए बेहतर से बेहतर ट्रेन में फर्स्ट क्लास यात्रा मुफ्त दी जाती है। क्या वाहनों के चलने की अवधि और भेदभाव वाले ऐसे कानूनों में परिवर्तन करने की गंभीर जरूरत नहीं है? और ऊपर से जब कोई हादसा होता है, तो

केन्द्र सरकार के जवाबदेही वाले मंत्री न सवालों के जवाब देते हैं और न कोई जिम्मेदारी अपने ऊपर लेते हैं। जबकि एक समय था कि किसी भी हादसे पर मंत्री अपने इस्तीफे खुद दे दिया करते थे। आज कोई नेता या मंत्री इस्तीफा नहीं देता, क्योंकि इस्तीफा अब अपनी गलती मानकर शर्मसार होने का प्रतीक नहीं, हार मानने का प्रतीक बना दिया गया है। सत्ताधारी वर्ग छवि प्रबंधन यानि इमेज मैनेजमेंट में माहिर हो गया है। सत्ता अब मीडिया, सोशल मीडिया और पेंड मैनेजिन्स से चलती है, जवाबदेही से नहीं। आखिर जवाबदेही अब सिस्टम का हिस्सा क्यों नहीं रही? यह केवल एक आलेख नहीं, बल्कि एक आत्मिक दस्तावेज है और एक ऐसी सच्चाई का आईना है, जिस आमतौर पर या तो नजरअंदाज कर दिया जाता है या फिर सत्ता के शोर-गुल या दूसरे बड़े मुद्दे को उठाकर दबा दिया जाता है। अब हर त्रासदी या



हादसे के बाद वही सुनने को मिलता है कि हमारे पास मृतकों का आधिकारिक आंकड़ा नहीं है। या ये कहा जाता है कि हादसे को कोन रोक सकता है। इसका मतलब ये है कि मौतें सिर्फ खबरें हैं और वो अखबारी शब्दों में सिमटी या छुपाई गई संख्या बन चुकी हैं, जिन्हें कहीं ऊपर से मैनेज किया जाता है कि मौतों के आंकड़े कितने देने हैं और धीरे-धीरे देने हैं। और ये चलन बन गया है कि कहीं भी चाहे हादसा किसी भी प्रकार का हो, अगर गलती अपनी सरकार में हुई है, तो उस पर शेरमी से अपनी गलती छुपाने या जिम्मेदारी से भागने के लिए लोपापोती करनी है और जनता को गुमराह रखना है। दरअसल, जब किसी पार्टी और उसके नेताओं का लक्ष्य सिर्फ चुनाव जीतना ही हो, तो जवाबदेही एक बोझ लगने लगती है। इसीलिए ऐसी पार्टियों की सरकारों में न इस्तीफे होते हैं, न माफ़ी मांगी जाती है, सिर्फ पीआर कैंपेन चलती है। क्योंकि हमें भावनाओं से बांध दिया गया है। अगर सवाल पूछे या सरकार या किसी मंत्री पर उंगली उठाई, तो देशद्रोही का टैग लगा देना अब आम बात हो चुकी है। पार्टियाँ और सरकारों के लिए ये इसलिए आसान हो चुका है, क्योंकि हम राष्ट्रभक्ति, राष्ट्रप्रेम, राष्ट्रपक्षा, धर्म, संस्कृति को अपना सर्वस्व मानते हैं और जातीयता की जंजीरों में हमें जकड़कर रखा गया है। और मौलाना कहता है कि इसान, खास तौर पर आम इसान जिन चीजों को दिल की गहराइयों से मानता है, उनकी आड़ में उसे आसानी से भावुक और ब्लैकमेल किया जा सकता है। और अगर वो फिर भी एक जागरूक नागरिक है और सवाल मार्किट शब्दों के खिलाफ बताकर देशद्रोही, धर्मद्रोही, असभ्य और दुश्मन देश का नागरिक बता दो, जिससे वो सवाल करने की जगह अपने बचाव में लग जाए। यही वजह है कि आज

ज्यादातर लोग सवाल नहीं करते और जो सवाल करते हैं, उन्हें देशद्रोही या धर्मद्रोही, पाकिस्तानी या असभ्य बताकर बुनियादी सवालों से दूर होने को मजबूर कर दो। फिर भी कोई न माने, तो उसे पीट दो, उसकी हत्या करा दो या उसके ऊपर संगीन मामलों के तहत रिपोर्ट दर्ज करारक छूटे मुकदमों में फंसा दो या जेल भेज दो। आखिर ये सब हो क्या रहा है? क्या किसी हादसे या कमी के लिए कौन जिम्मेदार है? ये पूछना गुनाह है? नहीं, ये लोकतंत्र की आत्मा है, जिसे जिन्दार खना बहुत जरूरी है, वरना वो दिन दूर नहीं, जब आम आदमी गुलामी की जंजीरों में उसी तरह जकड़ा नजर आएगा, जिस तरह अमेज़ो ने हम हिंस्त्रानियों को जकड़ा था। इसलिए मेरा मानना है कि लोग भावनाओं में बहकर नहीं, बल्कि सरकारों और नेताओं के कामकाज पर ध्यान केंद्रित करें। वर्ना हादसे होंगे, अत्याचार होंगे, अपराध होंगे और जवाब देने वाला कोई नहीं होगा। क्योंकि लोकतंत्र में जब जनता से जाती है, तब सत्ता मनमानी करने लगती है। विपक्ष का भी असली काम सरकार से जवाब मांगना है और ज़ुूर रहना एक अपराध है और लोकतंत्र की हत्या में एक मूक सहमति है। अगर सरकार विपक्षियों की नहीं सुनती है, तो उन्हें चाहिए कि वे हर समस्या को आंदोलन में बदल दें, ताकि सरकार किसी भी मामले से भागे नहीं, बल्कि मजबूर होकर सही, लेकिन जिम्मेदार बने। अब सवाल ये है कि अप्रैल में एअर इंडिया ने बोइंग 787-8 ड्रैगमालिनर के लिए बीमा कवर 750 करोड़ रुपए से कर 850 करोड़ रुपए कर दिया गया था और अहमदाबाद में हुए इस जहाज हादसे के बाद टाटा मुक्त को इस जहाज के हादसे में खत्म हो जाने के बदले तकरीबन 3 हजार करोड़ रुपए इश्योरेंस कंपनी को भरने पड़ सकते हैं, जो कि अब तक का सबसे बड़ा इश्योरेंस क्लेम होगा। कहा जा रहा है कि इस क्लेम से एविएशन इश्योरेंस सेक्टर में भूचाल आ सकता है। लेकिन उनका क्या, जिनकी जान चली जाती है या जो किसी हादसे में अगलजग हो जाते हैं या गुरी तरह चोटिल हो जाते हैं और अपने इलाज में लाखों रुपए खर्च करने को मजबूर होते हैं। अहमदाबाद के जहाज हादसे में भी मरने वालों के परिजनों को और उस हॉस्पिटल में मौजूद मरने वालों के परिजनों को कुछ खास नहीं मिलेगा। इसमें तो मिलेगा भी, लेकिन सड़क और रेल हादसों में मारे गए ज्यादातर लोगों के परिजनों और हमेशा के लिए हैंडिकैप होने या चोटिल होने पर हादसे के शिकार लोगों को कोई मुआवजा तक नहीं मिलता।

आज देश में हर साल तकरीबन पांच लाख से ज्यादा बड़े सड़क हादसे होते हैं, जिनमें तकरीबन दो लाख लोग मारे जाते हैं और तकरीबन तीन लाख से ज्यादा लोग गंभीर रूप से घायल होते हैं। इसी तरह ट्रेन हादसे में मारे गए बहुत से लोगों की गिनती इसलिए नहीं होती, क्योंकि वो ज़रूर या रियेक्शन केफर्म में होने पर यात्रा करते हैं। रिपोर्ट बताती है कि सिर्फ केन्द्र की मोदी सरकार में साल 2014 से साल 2024 तक देश भर में 641 ट्रेन हादसे हो चुके हैं, लेकिन कोई बड़ी जिम्मेदारी अभी तक मौजूद सरकार के जिम्मेदार रेल मंत्री या प्रधानमंत्री ने अपने सिर पर लेते हुए इस्तीफा देने की बात तो दूर, माफ़ी तक नहीं मांगी है। इसी तरह देश में कई विमान हादसे भी हो चुके हैं, लेकिन सिर्फ जांच का दिलासा मिल जाता है, जिम्मेदारी लेने वाला कोई नहीं।

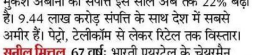

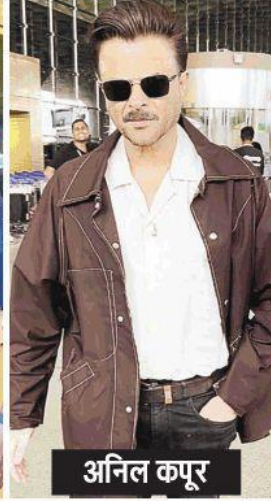

नई दिल्ली, 1 जुलाई (ए.एन.आई.): हाल ही में हुए अहमदाबाद प्लेन क्रैश के बाद एक और बड़ा हादसा होते-होते बच गया। एयर इंडिया के विमान ने नई दिल्ली के इंदिरा गांधी इंटरनैशनल एयरपोर्ट से वियना के लिए उड़ान भरी थी। इसके बाद यह विमान बीच हवा में 900 फुट तक नीचे आ गया।

एयरलाइन ने बयान जारी करते हुए कहा कि जांच के नतीजे आने तक दोनों पायलटों को रोस्टर से हटा दिया गया है। यह घटना अहमदाबाद प्लेन क्रैश के 2 दिन बाद हुई।

एयर इंडिया के प्रवक्ता ने कहा, “पायलट की रिपोर्ट मिलने के बाद नियमों के मुताबिक डी.जी.सी.ए. को मामले की जानकारी दी गई।”

टेकऑफ के बाद 900 फीट नीचे आया एअर इंडिया विमान

एक्शन में डीजीसीए, दोनों पायलट हटाए गए

दिल्ली से वियना जा रही एअर इंडिया की एक अंतरराष्ट्रीय उड़ान में बड़ा हादसा टल गया। उड़ान भरने के कुछ ही मिनट बाद विमान अचानक हवा में 900 फीट नीचे आ गया, जिससे यात्रियों की सुरक्षा को लेकर गंभीर सवाल खड़े हो गए हैं। यह घटना 14 जून को फ्लाइट एआई-187 के साथ हुई, जो बोइंग 777 विमान था और इंदिरा गांधी इंटरनेशनल एयरपोर्ट से रात 2:56 बजे खाना हुआ था।

टेकऑफ के तुरंत बाद विमान ने एल्टीट्यूड खो दिया और अचानक नीचे गिरने लगा। इस दौरान विमान में स्टॉल और ग्राउंड प्रॉक्सिमिटी वॉर्निंग अलर्ट सक्रिय हो गए, जिनमें डोंट सिंक जैसी चेतावनियां शामिल थीं। हालांकि, पायलटों ने तुरंत एक्शन लेते हुए विमान को स्थिर किया और मौसम की चुनौतीपूर्ण परिस्थितियों के बावजूद विमान को वियना तक सुरक्षित पहुंचाया। एअर इंडिया के प्रवक्ता के अनुसार घटना की सूचना नियमों के तहत नागरिक उड्डयन महानिदेशालय (डीजीसीए) को दे दी गई है। फ्लाइट रिकॉर्डर से डेटा प्राप्त कर जांच शुरू कर दी गई है। जब तक जांच पूरी नहीं हो जाती, दोनों पायलटों को उड़ान ड्यूटी से हटा दिया गया है। डीजीसीए ने मामले

की गंभीरता को देखते हुए एअर इंडिया के सेफ्टी चीफ को भी तलब किया है और विस्तृत जांच शुरू कर दी है।

यह घटना ऐसे समय पर हुई है जब इससे महज दो दिन पहले, 12 जून को अहमदाबाद से लंदन जा रही एअर इंडिया की एक उड़ान टेकऑफ के तुरंत बाद क्रैश हो गई थी, जिसमें 270 लोगों की जान चली गई थी। इसके अलावा, डीजीसीए के हालिया ऑडिट में एअर इंडिया की फ्लीट में मेंटेनेंस को लेकर लापरवाही की बात भी सामने आई है। डीजीसीए ने 23 जून को एअर इंडिया के गुरुग्राम स्थित बेस पर विस्तृत ऑडिट शुरू कर दिया है, जिसमें ऑपरेशंस, रोस्ट्रिंग और तकनीकी प्रोटोकॉल की समीक्षा की जा रही है।

सुरक्षित हवाई यात्रा के लिए बने नई व्यवस्था

12 जून को 230 सवारियों वाली एयर इंडिया की उड़ान संख्या 171 ने अहमदाबाद हवाई अड्डे से उड़ान भरी। तीस सैकेंड बाद बोइंग 787-8 ड्रीमलाइनर एक मेडिकल कॉलेज के हॉस्टल पर गिर पड़ा। उस हादसे को रोका जा सकता था, दुर्घटना ने उस विमान की बदहाली की पोल तो खोली ही, विमानन क्षेत्र से जुड़े पूरे तंत्र में व्याप्त सड़ांध को भी उजागर कर दिया। किसी भी लोकतंत्र में ऐसे हादसे जानने का अवसर होते हैं लेकिन भारत में ऐसा नहीं है। इसके बजाय मृतकों के शोकाकुल परिजन शवों की तस्वीरों और अनुरति प्रश्नों के साथ एक से दूसरे मुद्दों पर दौड़ रहे थे। संकट के समय मदद करने के लिए कोई टीम नहीं थी।

एयरलाइंस द्वारा हत्या करके बच निकलने का मुख्य कारण यह है कि उनकी जिम्मेदारी तय करने के लिए कोई विनियामक नहीं है। सच तो यह है कि वह कोई हादसा नहीं था, यह दैनंदिन अक्षमता के वेश में सुनियोजित लापरवाही थी। भारत का विमानन क्षेत्र ऊंची उड़ान नहीं भर रहा, यह विनियंत्रण के स्तर पर डरे होने, कॉरपोरेट लालच और राजनीतिक उदासीनता का मिलाजुला रूप है। नतीजतन रनवे पर, हवा में और जिम्मेदार लोगों के हाथों में-सर्वत्र खून है, दो कंपनियों के नियंत्रण वाला

विमानन क्षेत्र सिर्फ एयरलाइंस का संचालन नहीं कर रहा, लोगों के मुताबिक, 35,000 फीट की ऊंचाई पर यह उगाही का तंत्र चलाता है। इन दो प्रमुख एयरलाइन समूहों का भारतीय आकाश के 88.5 फीसदी हिस्से पर कब्जा है।

विमानों के किराये का नमूना देखिये : दिल्ली-चंडीगढ़ के बीच 50 मिनट की उड़ान के 8,500 रुपये, चेन्नई से कोयंबटूर के लिए 10,200 रुपये, पिछले साल इंडिगो ने 11.8 करोड़ मुसाफिरों को गंतव्य तक पहुंचाया और 7258 करोड़ रुपये का मुनाफा कमाया। एयर इंडिया हिसाब-किताब के मामले में शालीनता दिखाती है लेकिन एक बार में 470 विमानों के ऑर्डर देने का फैसला उसकी ताकत के बारे में बताता है। गो फर्स्ट के खत्म हो जाने और स्पाइसजेट की हिस्सेदारी घटकर चार फीसदी रह जाने के बाद भारतीय विमानन क्षेत्र में कोई प्रतिस्पर्धा नहीं है-सिर्फ कार्टेल पूंजीवाद है और विनियामक? जरा लकिए, भारत में कोई विनियामक नहीं है। यहाँ डीजीसीए यानी नागर विमानन महानिदेशालय है, नागर विमानन के लिए डीजीसीए का होना वैसा ही है, जैसे चाकू की जगह दूधपिक हो।

भारत का तथाकथित विमानन विनियामक फंड और संसाधन की कमी के साथ राजनीतिक अंकुश से जूझ रहा है, इसमें 53 फीसदी पद खाली हैं, जबकि संसाधनों में 91 फीसदी कटौती की गयी है। नई से जागर 24 जून को उसने जो जांच रिपोर्ट जारी की, वह डरावने उपन्यास की तरह लगता था। उसने रिपोर्ट में व्यवहार के अयोग्य बैगैज ट्रांली, गलत ढंग से रखे लाइफ

वेस्ट्स, खरखराव के प्रोटोकॉल की अनदेखी, लगातार होने वाली तकनीकी चूक आदि का जिक्र किया है। डीजीसीए ने इन कमियों पर क्या रुख दिखाया? उसने एक प्रेस रिलीज जारी की, अपनी पीठ धपथपायी, फिर लंबी नई में सो गया।

भारत बड़े विमानन बाजार वाला इकलौता देश है, जिसके पास वैधानिक रूप से और स्वतंत्र विनियामक नहीं है। ब्रिटेन, ब्राजील, दक्षिण अफ्रीका और पड़ोसी नेपाल तक में ऐसे स्वतंत्र



निकाय हैं, जिन्हें विमानों पर उड़ान प्रतिबंध लगाने, जर्माना लगाने, यात्री अधिकारों को लागू करने, यहाँ तक कि अधिकारियों को जेल में डालने के लिए भी मंत्रियों से अनुमति लेने की जरूरत नहीं पड़ती। अमेरिका के संघीय विमानन प्राधिकरण (एफएए) में 45,000 कर्मचारी हैं और उसका 20 अरब डॉलर का सालाना बजट है, भारत में डीजीसीए समय पर हादसे की रिपोर्ट जारी कर दे तो यही बहुत है।

दूसरे देशों में विमान दुर्घटनाओं के बाद सुधार लागू होते हैं, वर्ष 2008 के स्पेन एयर हादसे के बाद यूरोपीय संघ

ने सेफ्टी मैनेजमेंट सिस्टम लागू किया। वर्ष 2018-19 में 737 मैक्स हादसे के बाद एफएए ने बोइंग जेट्स पर 20 महीने का उड़ान प्रतिबंध लगाने के साथ बदलाव भी किये। वर्ष 2023 में विमान के इंजनों का मुद्दा सामने आने के बाद ऑस्ट्रेलिया का सीएसए हरकत में आया। जापान में इसी साल टोक्यो के रनवे में हुई टक्कर के तुरंत बाद जेटीएसबी सक्रिय हो गया। अपने यहाँ अहमदाबाद विमान हादसे के दो सप्ताह बाद तक डीजीसीए चुप रहा। भारतीय

विमानन क्षेत्र में सिर्फ फेयर मीटर ही तेज दौड़ता है। हाँ, हमारे यहाँ एयरपोर्ट क्वालिटी के लिए विनियामक है, क्योंकि रनवे के टाइल्स यात्रियों के जीवन से ज्यादा महत्व रखते हैं। विगत मार्च में कोलकाता से दिल्ली जा रही इंडिगो की एक उड़ान को खरब मौसम के कारण जब जयपुर में उतारा गया तो एक यात्री प्रिया शर्मा अपने पिता के अंतिम संस्कार में उपस्थित नहीं हो सकी।

बेंगलुरु से हैदराबाद जा रही उड़ान में जब एक महिला बेहोश हो गयी तो कू ने उसकी अन्देखी की, तब महिला

की बेटी को रोते हुए बताना पड़ा कि यह मेरी माँ है। पिछले महीने गुवाहाटी से चेन्नई जा रहे इंडिगो के एक विमान के पायलट ने ईंधन भरने के लिए मे डे कॉल किया। दिल्ली से श्रीनगर जा रहा एक विमान ओलावृष्टि से जर्जर हो गया। अहमदाबाद हवाई अड्डे पर एक साल में बर्ड हिट के 462 मामले पाये गये। अहमदाबाद हादसे के बाद भारत को बड़ा कदम उठाने की जरूरत है, इसे सुधार के लिए जुबानी वादे की जरूरत नहीं है। नही किसी कमेटी या 700 पेज की रिपोर्ट की जरूरत है। इस मौजूदा व्यवस्था को खत्म कर नई व्यवस्था शुरू करनी होगी। देश को एक स्वतंत्र नागर विमानन विनियामक प्राधिकरण की जरूरत है जो पूरी तरह वैधानिक हो, जिसके पास अधिकार हो और जिस पर राजनीतिक दखल न हो। इस प्राधिकरण को विदेशी विशेषज्ञ नियुक्त करने दें। इसके पास बड़ा बजट हो, किराये के मामले में पारदर्शिता होनी चाहिए।

उड़ानों और यात्रियों के रिकॉर्ड के साथ छेड़छाड़ करने वाले सीईओ को जेल क्यों नहीं भेजा जाता? यात्रियों के साथ मानवीय सलुक होना चाहिए और संकट के समय किराया घटाया जाना चाहिए, हर हादसे, डायवर्जन या इमर्जेंसी लैंडिंग के ऑडिट का कानून बनाया जाना चाहिए। बीमा राशि सालों बाद नहीं, कुछ हफ्ते बाद मिल जानी चाहिए। उड़ान के दौरान जहरीले खान-पान और उद्दंड क्रू मेंबर्स पर प्रतिबंध लगाया जाए। हर विमान हादसे के पीछे खराब मौसम या तकनीकी गलती को कारण बताया जाता है लेकिन कभी उस व्यवस्थागत सड़ांध का जिक्र नहीं होता जो विमान हादसों के लिए जिम्मेदार होते हैं।

बारुद व बम बनाकर उद्योग जगत में नुवाल ने मचाई हलचल, अंबानी व अदाणी रहे पीछे

नई दिल्ली। इस साल की पहली छमाही में एक उद्योगपति ने कमाई के मामले में भारत के दिग्गज कारोबारी मुकेश अंबानी और गौतम अदाणी को भी पीछे छोड़ दिया है। वैश्विक जगत में पिछले छह महीने के दौरान भले ही जबरदस्त उथल पुथल रही हो, लेकिन इनकी नेटवर्थ में 78 फीसदी का जबरदस्त इजाफा हुआ है। ये अरबपति हैं सोलर इंडस्ट्रीज इंडिया के सह-संस्थापक और प्रसिद्ध सत्यनारायण नुवाल। ब्लूमबर्ग बिलियनेयर इंडेक्स के मुताबिक इनकी संपत्ति में सिर्फ इस साल की छमाही के दौरान ही 78 फीसदी के इजाफे के बाद कुल संपत्ति अब 7.90 बिलियन डॉलर हो गई है। सबसे खास बात ये है कि इनकी कंपनी डेटोनेटर, एक्सप्लोसिव और एम्यूनिशन बनती है और इसका हेडक्वार्टर नागपुर में स्थित है। सोलर इंडस्ट्रीज के शेयर में जहां 2024 में पैतालीस प्रतिशत तो वहीं दो साल पहले 2023 में चौवन प्रतिशत का इजाफा हुआ था। इस साल कंपनी के शेयर में करीब 81 प्रतिशत की तगड़ी उछाल देखी जा रही है। वर्तमान में कंपनी के शेयर नेशनल स्टॉक एक्सचेंस में 17,200 रुपये के मूल्य पर ट्रेड कर रहा है। राजस्थान के भीलवाड़ा में एक मध्यमवर्गीय परिवार में जन्मे सत्यनारायण नुवाल ने सिर्फ दसवीं तक पढ़ाई की है। 10वीं से आगे वो पढ़ाई नहीं कर पाए। पिता पटवारी थे और 1971 में उनके रिटायर होने के बाद परिवार की जरूरतें पूरी करने के लिए संघर्ष करने लगे। नुवाल के दादा छोटी सी परचून की दुकान चलाते थे, स्कूल के बाद वह अपने दादा की मदद किया करते थे।

पुणे फ्लाइट रद्द, दुबई फ्लाइट देरी से उड़ी

नवज्योति, जयपुर। जयपुर एयरपोर्ट से मंगलवार को पुणे जाने वाली फ्लाइट का संचालन रद्द रहा। दुबई जाने वाली फ्लाइट भी देरी से संचालित हुई। स्पाइसजेट की जयपुर से सुबह 5.05 बजे पुणे जाने वाली फ्लाइट का संचालन तकनीकी कारणों के चलते रद्द कर दिया गया। इसी प्रकार स्पाइसजेट की जयपुर से सुबह 9.30 बजे दुबई जाने वाली फ्लाइट सुबह 10.15 बजे दुबई के लिए रवाना हुई। इसके चलते यात्रियों को परेशानी का सामना करना पड़ा।

5 नई फ्लाइट्स शुरू: जयपुर एयरपोर्ट से मंगलवार से 5 नई फ्लाइट्स की शुरुआत हुई है। इंडिगो की जयपुर से दोपहर 12.55 बजे मुंबई, एयर इंडिया एक्सप्रेस की सुबह 9.50 बजे कोलकाता, एयर इंडिया एक्सप्रेस की दोपहर 12.35 बजे पुणे, और दोपहर 2.25 बजे सूरत के लिए फ्लाइट शुरू की गई है। अब जयपुर

एयरपोर्ट से रोजाना कुल 59 फ्लाइट्स का संचालन होगा।

जयपुर एयरपोर्ट पर नोटम समय में बदलाव: जयपुर एयरपोर्ट पर रनवे मेंटेनेंस के चलते लागू नोटम की समय अवधि में बदलाव किया गया है। पहले यह नोटम दोपहर 1 बजे से शाम 5 बजे तक रहता था, जिससे इस दौरान कोई फ्लाइट संचालित नहीं होती थी। अब इसे घटाकर दोपहर 2.30 बजे से शाम 4.30 बजे तक कर दिया गया है। इसके चलते सुबह 9.30 से शाम 6 बजे तक अब फ्लाइट्स का संचालन फिर से शुरू हो सकेगा। अभी तक इस अवधि में केवल 2 फ्लाइट ही चल रही थीं, लेकिन अब 16 फ्लाइट्स उड़ान भर सकेंगी। नोटम की वजह से जयपुर एयरपोर्ट पर एयर इंडिया की मुंबई फ्लाइट मंगलवार को करीब एक घंटे देरी से रवाना हुई।

भारतीय शेयर बाजार मंगलवार को हल्की बढ़त पर बंद हुआ। सप्ताह के दूसरे ही कारोबारी दिन दुनिया भर से मिले अच्छे संकेतों के बाद भी बाजार ज्यादा ऊपर नहीं आ पाया। दिन भर के कारोबार के बाद 30 शेयरों वाला बीएसई सेंसेक्स 90.83 अंकों की बढ़त के साथ ही 83,697.29 अंकों पर बंद हुआ। वहीं इसी प्रकार 50 शेयरों वाला एनएसई निफ्टी 24.75 अंकों की बढ़त के साथ ही 25,541.80 अंकों पर बंद हुआ। आज कारोबार के दौरान सेंसेक्स की 30 में से सिर्फ 13 कंपनियों के शेयर ही बढ़त के साथ ऊपर आकर बंद हुए, जबकि बाकी की सभी 17 कंपनियों के शेयर नुकसान के साथ ही नीचे बंद हुए। निफ्टी की 50 में से 24 कंपनियों के शेयर बढ़त के साथ ही लाभ पर बंद हुए और बाकी की 26 कंपनियों के शेयर नुकसान के साथ ही नीचे आये। आज सेंसेक्स की कंपनियों में शामिल बीईएल के शेयर सबसे ज्यादा 2.51 फीसदी की बढ़त के साथ बंद हुए जबकि एक्सिस बैंक के शेयर आज सबसे ज्यादा 2.13 फीसदी की गिरावट के साथ बंद हुए।

सेंसेक्स की अन्य कंपनियों में आज रिलायंस इंडस्ट्रीज के शेयर 1.84 फीसदी, एशियन पेंट्स 1.18 फीसदी, अल्ट्राटेक सीमेंट 1.10 फीसदी, कोटक महिंद्रा बैंक 0.93 फीसदी,

एचडीएफसी बैंक 0.60 फीसदी, टाइटन 0.30 फीसदी, भारती एयरटेल 0.29 फीसदी, भारतीय स्टेट बैंक 0.04 फीसदी और इंफोसिस के शेयर 0.04 फीसदी की तेजी के साथ बंद हुए। वहीं दूसरी ओर आज, टेक महिंद्रा 1.05 फीसदी, आईसीआईसीआई बैंक 0.95 फीसदी,



टीसीएस 0.89 फीसदी, एनटीपीसी 0.70 फीसदी, पावरग्रिड 0.67 फीसदी, एचसीएल टेक 0.60 फीसदी, टाटा मोटर्स 0.60 फीसदी, सनफार्मा 0.57 फीसदी, अडाणी पोर्ट्स 0.37 फीसदी, आईटीसी 0.31 फीसदी, महिंद्रा एंड महिंद्रा 0.25 फीसदी, मारुति सुजुकी 0.23 फीसदी नुकसान के साथ बंद हुए।

वहीं इससे पहले आज सुबह बाजार हरे निशान में खुले। शुरूआती कारोबार में ऑटो और आईटी सेक्टर में खरीदारी देखी गई। सेंसेक्स 188.66 अंक बढ़कर 83,795.12 पर

कारोबार कर रहा था, जबकि निफ्टी 54.80 अंक बढ़कर 25,571.85 पर कारोबार कर रहा था। विश्लेषकों के अनुसार अमेरिकी बाजार के नए रिकॉर्ड ऊंचाई पर पहुंचने के साथ, ग्लोबल इक्विटी बाजार का मूड सकारात्मक है और पश्चिम एशियाई भू-राजनीति अब वैश्विक अर्थव्यवस्था के लिए खतरा नहीं है। शुरूआती कारोबार में निफ्टी बैंक 51.95 अंक बढ़कर 57,364.70 पर कारोबार कर रहा था। निफ्टी मिडकैप 100 इंडेक्स 146.45 अंक की बढ़त के साथ 59,887.65 पर कारोबार कर रहा था। निफ्टी स्मॉलकैप 100 इंडेक्स 52.50 अंक की बढ़त के साथ 19,127.60 पर था। वहीं सोमवार को 30 शेयरों वाला बीएसई सेंसेक्स 452.44 अंक गिरकर 83,606.46 अंक पर बंद हुआ। एनएसई निफ्टी 120.75 अंक गिरकर 25,517.05 अंक पर बंद हुआ। वहीं एशियाई बाजारों में चीन, बैंकॉक, सोल और जकार्ता हरे रंग में कारोबार कर रहे थे, जबकि केवल जापान लाल रंग में कारोबार कर रहा था। पिछले कारोबारी सत्र में अमेरिका में डाउ जॉन्स 275.50 अंक की बढ़त के साथ 44,094.77 पर बंद हुआ। एसएंडपी 500 इंडेक्स 31.87 अंक की बढ़त के साथ 6,204.94 पर बंद हुआ और नैस्डैक 96.27 अंक की बढ़त के साथ 20,369.73 पर बंद हुआ।

अहमदाबाद। 12 जून को अहमदाबाद में हुए एअर इंडिया 171 विमान हादसे में जान गंवाने वालों के ब्रिटेन में रह रहे परिजन अब एअर इंडिया और बोइंग के खिलाफ अदालत का दरवाजा खटखटाने पर विचार कर रहे हैं। ब्रिटेन में रहने वाले पीड़ित परिवार लंदन की कानूनी फर्म से बातचीत कर रहे हैं ताकि संभावित मुकदमे दायर किए जा सकें। मीडिया रिपोर्ट में सूत्रों के हवाले से बताया गया है कि इस हफ्ते यूके में रहने वाले कई परिवारों के साथ बैठकें निर्धारित की गई हैं, जिनमें कानूनी रणनीति पर चर्चा की जाएगी। इन बैठकों के बाद अगली कार्रवाई को लेकर कोई ठोस फैसला लिया जाएगा। लंदन की कानूनी फर्म ने कहा कि हम एअर इंडिया की मुख्य विमानन बीमा कंपनी टाटा एआईजी की ओर से हाल ही में की गई वित्तीय सेटलमेंट की शुरूआती पेशकशों की समीक्षा कर रहे हैं।

एअर इंडिया का विमान 14 जून को सुबह 2.56 बजे इंदिरा गांधी इंटरनेशनल एयरपोर्ट से रवाना हुआ, इसके बाद नौ घंटे और आठ मिनट फ्लाइट के बाद सुरक्षित रूप से वियना में उतरा। हालांकि, टेकआफ

के तुरंत बाद विमान ने अचानक एल्टीट्यूड खो दिया, जिससे स्टाल और ग्राउंड प्राक्सिमिटी वार्निंग शुरू हो गई, जिसमें बार-बार 'डोन्ट सिंक' अलर्ट शामिल थे। एअर इंडिया ने कहा कि पायलटों ने विमान को स्थिर करने के लिए तुरंत एक्शन लिया और चुनौतीपूर्ण मौसम की स्थिति के बावजूद सुरक्षित यात्रा जारी रखी।

दिल्ली से वियना जा रहा था विमान, अहमदाबाद प्लेन क्रैश के 2 दिन बाद की घटना

नई दिल्ली। अहमदाबाद प्लेन क्रैश के 2 दिन बाद 14 जून को एअर इंडिया की एक और फ्लाइट हवा में 900 मीटर नीचे आ गई थी। यह घटना दिल्ली-वियना फ्लाइट के दौरान हुई थी। रिपोर्ट्स के मुताबिक, विमान ने दिल्ली एयरपोर्ट से टेकऑफ किया और उसके बाद वह नीचे आने लगी। हालांकि, 9 घंटे 8 मिनट की उड़ान के बाद यह फ्लाइट वियना में सुरक्षित लैंड हुई थी। एअर इंडिया ने कहा कि घटना की जांच शुरू कर दी गई है। रिपोर्ट सामने आने तक दोनों पायलट्स को ड्यूटी से हटा दिया गया है। एयरलाइन ने इस बात की जानकारी डायरेक्टोरेट जनरल ऑफ सिविल एविएशन को भी दे दी है। एअर इंडिया ने बताया कि रिकॉर्डर से डेटा कलेक्ट कर लिया गया है और आगे की जांच जारी है। 12 जून को अहमदाबाद से लंदन जा रही एअर इंडिया की फ्लाइट इक्र 71 टेकऑफ के कुछ ही देर बाद एक मेडिकल हॉस्टल की इमारत से टकरा गई थी। इसमें 275 लोगों की मौत हो गई थी, जिनमें 241 यात्री और क्रू मेंबर शामिल थे। सिर्फ एक यात्री इस हादसे में जिंदा बचा था। टोक्यो के हनेडा एयरपोर्ट से दिल्ली आ रही एअर इंडिया की फ्लाइट इक्र 857 कोलकाता डायवर्ट की गई थी। फ्लाइट के केबिन का तापमान लगातार गर्म बना हुआ था, इसके कारण फ्लाइट का रास्ता बदला गया। पुणे से हैदराबाद जाने वाली फ्लाइट को तकनीकी खामी के बाद विजयवाड़ा डायवर्ट किया गया था। फ्लाइट जब नेल्लोर के पास हवा में थी तब खराबी का पता चला था, इसके तुरंत बाद ही फ्लाइट को डायवर्ट किया गया। विमान में 159 यात्रियों और 6 क्रू मेंबर्स थे। एअर इंडिया की मुंबई से चेन्नई जा रही फ्लाइट उड़ान भरने के बाद वापस मुंबई लौटाई गई थी। फ्लाइट में केबिन के भीतर से जलने की बदबू आ रही थी। एयरलाइन के मुताबिक फ्लाइट सुरक्षित मुंबई एयरपोर्ट पहुंची थी। इसके बाद एयरक्राफ्ट को बदला गया था। यात्रियों को ग्राउंड स्टाफ ने सभी जरूरी चीजें मुहैया कराईं।

जीएसटी धोखाधड़ी सिंडिकेट का पर्दाफाश : चीमा

चंडीगढ़। पंजाब के जीएसटी संग्रह में इस बार रिकॉर्ड 44.44 प्रतिशत की बढ़ोतरी हुई है। जून 2025 में 2379.90 करोड़ का जीएसटी संग्रह हुआ, जबकि जून 2024 में जीएसटी संग्रह सिर्फ 1647.69 करोड़ रुपये था। वित्त मंत्री हरपाल चीमा ने कहा कि जून माह में अब तक की यह सबसे अधिक बढ़ोतरी है, जिसने पिछले सभी रिकॉर्ड तोड़ दिए हैं। चीमा ने मंगलवार को प्रेसवार्ता के दौरान इस संबंध में जानकारी दी।

चीमा ने बताया कि वित्तीय वर्ष 2025- 26 की पहली तिमाही में भी 27 प्रतिशत की रिकॉर्ड बढ़ोतरी दर्ज की गई है। साथ ही राज्य के पांच शीर्ष करदाताओं को राज्य के आर्थिक विकास और राजस्व उत्पादन में उनके योगदान के लिए सम्मानित भी किया। इनमें अम्बुजा सीमेंट से आशु अग्निहोत्री, एचपीसीएल-मिन्नल एनर्जी लिमिटेड (एचएमईएल) से संजय मल्होत्रा, सैमसंग इंडिया प्राइवेट

चीमा ने कहा कि विभाग के स्टेट इंटेलिजेंस एंड प्रिवेंटिव यूनिट (एसआईपीयू) ने एक अकाउंटेंट द्वारा चलाए जा रहे जीएसटी धोखाधड़ी सिंडिकेट का पर्दाफाश किया है। इसके द्वारा जाली बिलिंग और आईटीसी धोखाधड़ी के लिए 20 जाली फर्में बनाई गई थीं। प्राथमिक जांच में 866.67 करोड़ रुपये के धोखाधड़ी वाले लेन-देन का पता चला है, जिससे 157.22 करोड़ रुपये की टैक्स चोरी होने का अनुमान है। इसके अलावा विभाग ने एक बड़े जीएसटी चोरी घोटाले का पर्दाफाश किया है, जिसमें मैसर्स मां दुर्गा रोडलाइनज 168 करोड़ रुपये के जाली ई-वे बिल बनाने और असीमित सामान की ढुलाई में शामिल पाया गया, जोकि एक ट्रांसपोर्टर के तौर पर रजिस्टर्ड है। इसमें 30.66 करोड़ रुपये की कर देनदारी शामिल है।

Bangladesh resolves Adani's payment concerns

মণ্ডিল কনভেনশনে। মৃত ও আহত যাত্রীদের ক্ষেত্রে কী করণীয়, নিম্নে দেওয়া হয়েছে বা মালগার হারিয়ে গেলে কী করতে হবে সে সবই বলা রয়েছে সেই কনভেনশনে। সুতরাং দাবি, সেই কনভেনশনের নিয়ম মেনে এয়ার ইন্ডিয়া আর্থিক ক্ষতিপূরণ দিচ্ছে কি না, মৃতদের পরিবারের পাশে দাঁড়িয়ে কি না, খতিয়ে নেওয়া হচ্ছে তা। তবে, সম্ভবত আর্থিক ক্ষতিপূরণ নয়। অন্য বিষয় নিয়ে মামলা হতে পারে বলে সুত্রের দাবি।

সাইকোলজিস্ট দেখাচ্ছেন। অ্যাংজাইটি কমাতে কেউ কেউ ওষুধও খাচ্ছেন।

সবে দিন কুড়ি কেটেছে। ১২ জুন আমেদাবাদে ভেঙে পড়েছে এয়ার ইন্ডিয়ার ড্রিমলাইনার। বিমানে থাকা যে ২৪১ জন মারা গিয়েছিলেন, তাঁদের মধ্যে ১০ জন কেবিন জু এবং দু’জন পাইলট। আর তার পর থেকে একটা অবর্ণনীয় মানসিক চাপ তৈরি হয়েছে ভারতের আকাশে উড়ে বেড়ানো পাইলট ও এয়ারহস্টেসদের উপরে।

জানা গিয়েছে, দুর্ঘটনার কয়েক ঘণ্টা পরে, ১২ জুনই নাইট শিফটে এয়ার ইন্ডিয়ার ২২১ জন কেবিন জু ‘সিক রিপোর্ট’ করেছিলেন বা অসুস্থতার কথা জানিয়েছিলেন। সে দিন দুপুরে ভয়াবহ দুর্ঘটনার পরে যে পাহাড়-প্রমাণ মানসিক চাপ তৈরি হয়েছিল, তা নিয়ে তাঁরা ফ্লাই করতে চাননি।

তাদের কয়েকজনের সঙ্গে কখনও না কখনও উড়েছি। কোনও স্টেশনে গিয়ে তিন-চার দিন একসঙ্গে থেকেছি। কেউ বন্ধুর মতো, কেউ বড় দিদির মতো। স্বজন ছেড়ে বাইরে গিয়ে পরিবারের মতো থাকি আমরা। সেই স্বজনহারার শোক তো আমাদেরও ঘিরে ধরেছে।’

এক সিনিয়র পাইলট বলছেন, ‘আমরা চেক-লিস্ট মেনেই জীবন যাপন করি। অনেক রেস্ট্রিকশন। আমরা প্রফেশনাল। ঘটনার পরে ককপিটে গিয়ে যখন বসেছি, বা এখনও যে বসছি, চোখের সামনে এক বলক উকি দিয়ে যাচ্ছে ধ্বংসস্থূপের ছবি। কিন্তু, পরমুহূর্তেই কনসেন্ট্রেন্ট করছি চেক-লিস্টে। আরও সতর্ক হয়ে খুঁটিয়ে দেখে নিচ্ছি সবকিছু। কিছু ভাবার অবকাশ নেই। এতগুলো মানুষের

দুঃস্বপ্নই

জীবন আমাদের হাতে। শুধু অবসরে, একা থাকার সময়ে একটা ক্লান্তি এসে গ্রাস করছে।’

পাইলটদের কথায়, তাদের থেকেও ১২ জুনের ঘটনা বেশি দাগ কেটে গিয়েছে কেবিন জু-দের উপরে। কাজ করছে একটা ইনসিকিউরিটিও। এক এয়ারহস্টেসের কথায়, ‘প্রতিটি টেক-অফের পরে ১০ হাজার ফুট পর্যন্ত আমরাও সিট বেল্ট পরে বসে নিজেদের মধ্যে নানা কথা বলি। ১২ জুনই ইভনিং ফ্লাইট ছিল। সিট-বেল্ট পরে আমরা চুপ করে বসেছিলাম। কেউ একটাও কথা বলিনি। দেখলাম, সামনে বসা প্যাসেঞ্জাররা আমাদের মুখের দিকে একদৃষ্টে তাকিয়ে আছেন। সে দিনের সেই দৃষ্টি কখনই ভুলব না। এতটা অসহায়তা কখনও প্যাসেঞ্জারদের চোখে দেখিনি।’

কোথাও যেন তাদের আত্মবিশ্বাসে ভয়ঙ্কর আঘাত লেগে গিয়েছে — মেনে নিচ্ছেন বেশিরভাগ পাইলটই। বার বার বলছেন, যে এয়ারক্র্যাটকে অজেয় বলা হতো, সেই ড্রিমলাইনারের এ ভাবে ভেঙে পড়া মেনে নিতে পারছেন না তাঁরা। প্রথম দু’দিন ড্রিমলাইনারের প্রায় কোনও

পাইলটই ঘুমোননি। নিজেদের মধ্যে চ্যাট করেছেন। কোথাও একটা সেঙ্গ অফ হেল্পলেসনেস কাজ করছে।

এক এয়ারহস্টেস বলছেন, ‘ঘটনার দিন আমি হোটеле ছিলাম। ফ্লাইটের প্রিপারেশন নিচ্ছিলাম। ঘরের টিভি খোলা ছিল। আচমকা ব্রেকিং নিউজ দেখে হাত-পা অবশ হয়ে যায়। হোটেলের বয় ঘরে ঢুকে আমাকে ওই অবস্থায় দেখে বলেন, ম্যাম প্লিজ হ্যাভ সাম ফুড। খেতে পারিনি। আমরা প্রশিক্ষিত। ইমার্জেন্সিতে কোথাও ল্যান্ড করলে, ডোর ওপেন থেকে প্যাসেঞ্জারকে ইভ্যাকুয়েট করা — সবটাই শিখেছি। কিন্তু, সে সুযোগ পেলে তো! সে দিন তো আমাদের দিদি-বোন-বন্ধুরা সেই সুযোগটাও পেল না। আমাদের ট্রেনিংয়ে শেখানো হয়, প্রতিটি টেক-অফ আর ল্যান্ডিং — তোমার নবজন্ম। সে দিনও তো এমনই কোনও নবজন্ম হতে পারত।’

আন্তে আন্তে পরিস্থিতি স্বাভাবিকও হচ্ছে। এক পাইলটের কথায়, ‘মানুষ এখন খুব তাড়াতাড়ি সব কিছু ভুলে যেতে শিখেছে। মনে আছে প্রায় ২০ বছর আগে পাটনা এয়ার জ্যাংশের পরে বেশ কিছুদিন ওই রুটে আমরা প্যাসেঞ্জারই পাইনি। খোঁজ নিয়ে দেখুন, এখন আমেদাবাদ-গ্যাটউইক রুটের ফ্লাইটও ফুল যাচ্ছে।’

अहमदाबादमध्ये झालेल्या विमान अपघातानंतर मुंबईत दादर येथे राहणारे आणि मूळ कच्छचे रहिवासी असलेल्या गांधी कुटुंबाची पुन्हा एकदा एका दुर्दैवी घटनेच्या आठवणीने झोप उडाली.

दादरच्या (पश्चिम) पोलीस चौकीजवळ राहणाऱ्या मूळ कच्छमधील असलेल्या ५९ वर्षीय निशित शांतिलाल गांधी यांनी अहमदाबाद विमान अपघातानंतर त्यांच्या वेदना व्यक्त करताना सांगितले की, १९९० मध्ये २ फेब्रुवारीला त्यांचे लग्न हिनाबरोबर झाले

होते. हनिमूनसाठी बंगळुरूला जाण्याचे त्यांनी नक्की केले होते. ट्रेनचे तिकीट न मिळाल्याने त्यांनी विमानाचे तिकीट बुक केले होते. आयुष्यात पहिल्यांदाच विमानाने प्रवास ते करणार होते.

१४ फेब्रुवारीला 'व्हॅलेंटाईन डे'च्या दिवशी मुंबईहून नियोजित वेळी २३०-एअर बस १३० प्रवाशांना घेऊन बंगळुरूकडे रवाना झाले होते. बंगळुरू एअरपोर्टवर विमानाच्या पायलटने लँडिंग सुरू केले; परंतु पायलटद्वारा काही चूक झाली आणि विमान 'रन-वे' सोडून एअरपोर्टच्या मोठ्या भिंतीवर जाऊन आदळले. या अपघातात १३० प्रवाशांमधून १५ लोक वाचले होते, मात्र ते देखील गंभीर जखमी झाले होते.

या विमान दुर्घटनेत केवळ दोनच लोक खऱ्या अर्थाने वाचले होते आणि त्यांना किरकोळ जखमही झाली नव्हती. यामध्ये स्वतः निशित गांधी आणि एका एअर होस्टेसचा समावेश होता. त्यांनी सीट बेल्ट बांधलेला नव्हता, त्यामुळे ते मागील सीटवर उडाले होते.

या वेळी त्यांच्या एका एअर

होस्टेसने ज्यांना वाचवता येणे शक्य होते त्यांना वाचवण्याचा प्रयत्न केला आणि विमानाच्या सुमारे २० फूट उंचावरून तिने गांधी यांना धक्का मारून बाहेर फेकले आणि स्वतः देखील उडी मारली. यावेळी ते दोघे खाली गवतावर पडल्याने त्यांना दुखापत झाली नाही.

मात्र, पत्नी हिनाला ते वाचवू शकले नाहीत. हिनाचा मृतदेह संपूर्ण जळाला होता. दुसऱ्या दिवशी मृतदेहावरील दागिन्यांवरून तिची ओळख पटली. अहमदाबाद दुर्घटनेनंतर या स्मृती पुन्हा ताज्या झाल्या. त्या वेळी झालेला विमान अपघात त्यांच्या डोळ्यांसमोर झाला असल्याने पुन्हा एकदा त्या आठवणींनी त्यांची झोप उडाली आहे.
