Delhi's new govt puts PMJAY implementation in fast lane

Ayushman Bharat training for state's staff begins

New Delhi, 21 February

In a bid to accelerate the implementation of Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) in Delhi, the state government, along with National Health Authority (NHA), has started the process of training staff who will generate PMJAY cards and pre-authorise medical procedures.

This comes a day after the Delhi government had cleared decks for introducing the Centre's health insurance scheme in the national capital. "We are currently working on training master trainers, who, in turn, will train around 5,000-6,000 field workers to handle card creation and backend processes such as claim processing and grievance redressal management," said an official in the know.

Kiran Gopal Vaska, joint secretary and mission director (Ayushman Bharat Digital

Mission), NHA, said the central agency is working with the state health department to work out modalities for onboarding Delhi on the PMJAY scheme.

"Work has already started on preparing a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to be signed by Delhi and creating a list of beneficiaries who will benefit under the scheme," he said.

According to a parliamentary response by the Union Health Ministry in 2023, around 654,000 families in Delhi are eligible to enrol under the scheme.

Similarly, a recent Ageing in India report puts the projected senior citizens' population in the capital at 1.9 million.

In a recent meeting to discuss implementation of the Ayushman Bharat programme, state officials had stated that a minimum of 100,000 beneficiaries would need to be enrolled for the

PMJAY card and the Vaya Vandana card within 30 days of approving the scheme by the cabinet.

"The beneficiaries will be families, according to National Food Security Act (NFSA) data, Socio Economic and Caste Census (SECC), 2011 data, or as decided by the Cabinet and senior citizens above 70 years," said the minutes of the meeting, accessed by Business Standard.

Similarly, the state government is also targeting to upgrade dispensaries run by the Delhi government as well as the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) into Ayushman Arogya Mandir-Primary Health Centres (AAM-PHCs). "A target for upgrading 11 PHCs has to be achieved within 30 days," the minutes stated.

The document added that the district magistrates (DMs) will need to ensure and oversee that the target is achieved in the 30-day timelines.

Sirsa says have started working on providing clean water and air from first meeting

NEW DELHI

DELHI Chief Minister Rekha Gupta's new Cabinet has begun working with a focus on fulfilling its commitments and ensuring public welfare.

Newly-appointed Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa on Friday outlined the Delhi government's priorities, emphasising initiatives for clean water, clean air, and the implementation of the Ayushman Bharat scheme as promised by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Speaking to reporters, he remarked, "We have started working on providing clean water and air from the very first meeting, along with implementing the Ayushman Bharat scheme. Additionally, we have resumed the process of providing subsidy cylinders to benefit the people."

He stressed that the government's main focus is on fulfilling its commitments and ensuring public welfare.

When asked about the performance of the previous Delhi Food and Supply Minister, Imran Hussain, Sirsa took a measured approach. "Our focus is on positivity. The people of Delhi faced several challenges under 'AAP-da' for many years, and we are committed to freeing them from those difficulties.

"If any wrongdoing has taken place, appropriate action will be taken. However, our pri-



ority is not targeting individuals but ensuring Delhi's development," he explained.

Meanwhile, Minister Ashish Sood reaffirmed the BJP-led Delhi government's commitment to providing free medical treatment worth up to Rs 10 lakh per citizen.

"This was a key promise made to the people, and we are actively working toward its fulfilment. Every guarantee given by Modi Ji will be honoured," Sood assured.

Amid these developments, former Delhi CM Atishi raised questions about the BJP's pre-election promise to provide monthly financial assistance to women.

Posting on X on Thursday, Atishi wrote, "BJP's Delhi government started cheating the people of Delhi from the very first day. Before the elections, PM Modi and all BJP leaders had promised that in the first Cabinet itself, they will pass a scheme to give Rs 2,500 per month to every woman in Delhi.

Multi-crore fake Ayushman card scam busted at PGI

Chandigarh: A multi-crore fraud has been uncovered at PGI, involving fake Ayushman Bharat cards and misappropriation of funds intended for underprivileged patients. Investigations revealed that forged doctor stamps were used to create fraudulent Ayushman cards, enabling ineligible individuals to access free medical treatment. Sources said that the scam, pegged at over Rs 5 crore, was active since 2021.

The fraud came to light after PGI security apprehended an individual in possession of indent books and forged doctor stamps at AMRIT pharmacy. "The man tried to escape when he was suspected by a security guard. Soon he was nabbed and frisked," said an official.

Notably, the FIR was lodged by the security office, not the PGI administration, raising concerns about the institution's response.

The fraud also highlights serious flaws in administering PGI's poor patient welfare fund. Critics allege that the system was compromised, allowing local politicians and doctors to recommend treatment without proper verification of patients' economic status.

UNCOVERING THE FRAUD

What is the procedure?

A patient who is entitled to any grant scheme must produce supporting documents with an endorsement from his treating physician for approval. After assessment of the treatment cost by the physician, the medicines are bought from approved vendors and handed over to the patients. These are documented in the indent book.



What happened?

The medicines, mainly costly cancer drugs, were sold off after these were bought in someone else's name, who was lost to follow-up

the names of patients who 'lost to follow-up' were used to fraudulently release funds, exploiting a vulnerable population. Questions about the long-term tenure of staff in the sensitive poor patient welfare cell, which violates Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) guidelines, have gone largely unanswered by PGI officials.

"An FIR was registered on Feb 19 with Chandigarh Police. The case pertains to the Ayushman Cell at PGI. Internally, all stakeholders have been reminded to remain vigilant. To strengthen the system, HIS 2 will be of great help," said a PGI spokesper-

son.

Police investigation has extended to radiotherapy and nephrology departments, where staff are being questioned about the seized stamps and indent books. Concerns have also been raised about missing pages in these indent books, which record the use of medicines and consumables, indicating a lack of transparency.

PGI's joint action committee, a union representing employees, has filed an RTI demanding answers about the missing indent books and the administration's plan to prevent their misuse in the future.

NEW DELHI: The new Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) administration will prune the number of mohalla clinics operating in Delhi, allowing only the facilities operating on government land to continue, and rename them as Ayushman Arogya Mandir, state health minister Pankaj Singh said on Friday.

In an interview, Singh also said that he had demanded a report on the mohalla clinics from the health department, alleged large-scale corruption in

what was the previous Aam Aadmi Party government's flagship scheme, and said the Ayushman Bharat insurance scheme will be implemented in the Capital from next week.

"The mohalla clinics which are running on government lands will continue to operate and those which are running on private rented facilities will definitely have to be closed. We are planning to rename the mohalla clinics as Ayushman Arogya Mandir and will add more health care facilities to the mohalla clinics," he said.

He added that the government will take action on "all the wrongdoings" of the previous regime in the running of the clinics. There are around 500 mohalla clinics operating in the Capital.

Separately, he told reporters that the government will consider adding ayurveda facilities.

"Cheating has been going on in the name of mohalla clinics. I have demanded a report on the mohalla clinics from the (health) department. The department will submit all the reports to me on Thursday," Singh added.

But he didn't offer clarity on whether the BJP government will investigate the allegations of corruption. "If we start a probe, the next five years will be insufficient because there has been so much corruption. We have come to work, and we will work," he said.

NEW DELHI: Delhi residents may soon see their government-provided health insurance coverage double from ₹5 lakh to ₹10 lakh, with the newly elected Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government set to implement the Centre's Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) in the Capital.

For a decade, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government relied on mohalla clinics and the Delhi Arogya Kosh scheme for free health care, declining to adopt AB-PMJAY. Now, in a major policy shift, chief minister Rekha Gupta has announced that Delhi will integrate with the central scheme, with the state adding a ₹5 lakh top-up, bringing total coverage to ₹10 lakh per family.

A memorandum of understanding (MoU) between the Delhi government and the

National Health Authority (NHA) is expected soon, paving the way for implementation.

"The MoU should be signed within a week. Then the state government will create a beneficiary database, followed by hospital empanelment and card distribution," said V Kiran Gopal, joint secretary, NHA.

Officials estimate around 650,000 beneficiaries, targeting the bottom 40% of Delhi's population. Currently, 66 Delhi hospitals—both government and private—are empanelled under the scheme. "These hospitals were to treat patients under the scheme portability benefit; but now more hospitals will join to provide treatment to Delhi residents. Delhi Hospitals will find on-boarding attractive as there are additional incentives for most hospitals that are NABH accredited and there's extra incentive for hospitals in tier-one cities," said Gopal.

According to people familiar with the matter, is a possibility Delhi government may merge the existing health insurance scheme—Delhi Arogya Kosh—with AB-PMJAY. Plans are also underfoot to rename mohalla clinics as aarogya mandirs.

"The preparatory note is ready and is to be sent to the cabinet. It's likely that there will be some modifications that may likely include merging existing health schemes with AB-PMJAY," he said.

On February 17, a meeting of Ayushman Bharat scheme was held at Delhi Secretariat. HT has accessed minutes of the meeting that said the discussion happened on implementation of ABPMJAY. Ayushman Arogya Mandirs, Ayushman Bharat Infrastructure Mission Scheme, Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission, and Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana in Delhi.

Man caught getting free medicines fraudulently

CHANDIGARH : A 25-year-old youth was caught fraudulently securing expensive medicines for free under the Ayushman Bharat scheme from PGIMER's Amrit Pharmacy using stamps and indent books of hospital's urology department.

Hailing from Kangra, Himachal Pradesh, the accused, Raman, had been securing the medicines, each

costing ₹30,000-35,000, over a span of two to three days under the false pretext of getting them for different patients. On his third visit, the pharmacy in-charge, Sunpreet, became suspicious when Raman couldn't provide details of the patients or doctors. As he tried to flee, he was caught by PGIMER security and handed over to police.

Upon investigation, a urology department's indent book and eight department stamps were found with him, leading to an FIR under Section 341 (3) of BNS.

PGIMER's medical superintendent Vipin Kaushal confirmed that along with police probe, an internal inquiry was underway to investigate how an outsider obtained these stamps

and the indent book.

The Ayushman Bharat scheme provides free treatment and medicines up to ₹5 lakh per year for eligible families. For medicines costing above ₹2,000, patients need the doctor's prescription in the indent book with stamps from the doctor, nursing officer, Ayushman counter and dispensary. **HTC**

SEEKS REPORT ON AAP'S FLAGSHIP CLINICS

Mohalla clinics on health minister radar, he promises action if corruption is found

A DAY after taking oath, newly appointed Health Minister Pankaj Kumar Singh has directed the Special Secretary of the department to submit a report on the Aam Aadmi Party's flagship mohalla clinics in a week. He directed that strict action should be taken if any corruption or loopholes are found.

After a meeting with health department officials, Singh said, "I held a meeting on mohalla clinics and have given special instructions to the special secretary health and other officials to submit a report on the number

of mohalla clinics that are functioning, how many are situated on Delhi government land and how many of them are running on rent; do the doctors come and work. In case they don't, how are bills raised?"

"I believe 30-40% of these mohalla clinics never even open for the public... If we find any loopholes and corruption, action will be taken and the person concerned will be charged..." he said.

Asked if he, as a minister, has launched an investigation into mohalla clinics, Singh said, "Yes, you can definitely say that... This is an investigation and action will be taken..."

The health minister also said they will rename the mohalla

clinics as Ayush Arogya Mandirs.

"We will upgrade and develop all the clinics constructed on government land and make

them better with facilities like Ayurveda and day care systems... We will invest in it and generate revenue... Delhi will see a big

change and development in the coming 100 days," he said.

Singh will visit Rao Tula Ram Hospital on Saturday. "I will also meet doctors to understand the current situation and the problems they are facing in the hospital... I've also sought a status report on the hospitals under construction and other pending projects..."

Singh, who is also the Transport minister, said free bus rides for women on DTC and cluster buses will continue and the city will see 11,000 electric buses in the next one year. "We also discussed the misuse of funds in the DTC and Transport department in the last 10 years. I will work on bringing the DTC out of revenue losses," he said.

Responsible tourism will drive growth, says Kerala CM Vijayan

INAUGURATING the Invest Kerala Global Summit at Kochi, Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan outlines the state's vision to become a leading investment hub, emphasising the creation of a "knowledge society." In an interview with **Priyanka Singh** of *The Tribune*, Vijayan highlights Kerala's tourism expansion, investment incentives and sectoral growth plans. Excerpts:

Q: Has the state seen a rise in domestic tourism?

Yes, and it's evident from the growth in places like Bekal in Kasargod, Kerala's northernmost district. In 1995, Bekal had only 50,000 visitors. Today, it welcomes over 5 lakh tourists annually. The ratio of foreign to domestic tourists was 1:33 in 2023, proving that travelers from across India are exploring Kerala beyond traditional hotspots like Munnar.

Q: How is Kerala planning to boost tourism further?

We are developing various tourism circuits, including a pilgrimage circuit, to showcase Kerala's heritage. Our responsible tourism model focuses on economic, social and environmental sustainability. Destinations



like Kumarakom have successfully implemented the model, benefiting local communities. Additionally, Kerala leads in medical and wellness tourism, particularly in Ayurveda and has the highest number of 5-star hotels in India.

Q: What sectoral growth does the government aim to achieve post-summit?

We are prioritising logistics, food processing, maritime, tourism, and hi-tech manufacturing. An industrial corridor in Palakkad is being developed for pharma and manufacturing industries. We will also establish private industrial estates and logistics parks to boost infrastructure.

Q: Many states, including Madhya Pradesh, are holding investment summits. What makes Kerala stand out?

Uphill task for Delhi CM

By appointing first-time legislator Rekha Gupta as Delhi Chief Minister, the BJP may have justifiably claimed to have walked the talk on honouring 'Nari Shakti' but the real challenges of governing the national capital lie ahead. Gupta, the fourth woman Chief Minister of Delhi, happens to be the only incumbent woman CM in any BJP-ruled State. Gender and community factors played a key role in the saffron party's choice for the coveted post. Nurtured in the student politics of Delhi University and rose through the ranks in the organisation, Gupta now has her hands full. As she gets down to the nitty-gritty of administrative business, she is up against many challenges — from managing the finances and fulfilling its main election promises to cleaning the Yamuna and improving civic conditions. Gupta's appointment was announced 11 days after the party's landslide victory in the Assembly elections, ending the AAP's 10-year regime. The other contenders included Parvesh Verma, the 'giant killer' who defeated AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal in the New Delhi seat; Delhi BJP general secretary Ashish Sood, former Leader of Opposition Vijender Gupta and Malviya Nagar MLA Satish Upadhyay. During the campaign, the BJP, in a bid to outsmart the AAP, had focused on wooing women voters, with the party's manifesto promising Rs 2,500 monthly aid for women, Rs 21,000 for pregnant women and pensions for seniors. For Gupta (50), whose campaign website's tagline is "Kaam hi Pehchaan" (my work is my identity), the implementation of the party's poll promises will prove to be an acid test.

There are high public expectations from the new government on a host of issues ranging from improving the condition of roads and ensuring drinking water supply to the construction of houses for the poor and regularisation of illegal colonies. The new government needs to get cracking to put together the budget for the new fiscal, keeping in mind allocations for the scheme for women as well as Rs 21,000 for pregnant women, as promised. The immediate implementation of the Ayushman Bharat scheme is also on top of the BJP's agenda. The previous AAP regime did not adopt it, becoming the only administration after the Trinamool Congress-led West Bengal government to reject the Centre's health insurance scheme. Cleaning Yamuna River is another big promise waiting to be implemented. The high pollution level in the river was a major talking point during the poll campaign, with the BJP promising to do what neither the Congress nor the AAP could achieve during their time in power. The ambitious plan, launched on February 16, 2025, aims to restore the polluted river within three years through a four-pronged strategy focusing on waste removal, drain cleaning, and sewage treatment plant upgrades and construction. With Prime Minister Narendra Modi according it a top priority, the BJP's success hinges on effectively executing the complex project.

An MoU between the Delhi government and the National Health Authority (NHA) for the implementation of the Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) in the national capital will be signed soon, officials said on Friday. The newly-formed Delhi Cabinet approved the implementation of the Ayushman Bharat health insurance scheme in the capital at its maiden meeting on Thursday.

The state government and the National Health Authority have already started the preparation for onboarding the state.

Under the scheme approved by the Cabinet, a total of ₹10 lakh health cover will be provided to each beneficiary, with the Centre and Delhi government contributing ₹5 lakh each.

Lauding the decision of the Delhi government, Union health minister J.P. Nadda on Friday said PM Narendra Modi's "gu-

arantee means every guarantee will be fulfilled."

Taking to X, Mr Nadda said, "Modi's guarantee means every guarantee will be fulfilled. I congratulate the Delhi government for the decision to implement the Ayushman Bharat Yojana in the first Cabinet meeting."

A day after taking oath, Delhi's new Health and Transport Minister Pankaj Singh on Thursday assured that the free bus service for women will continue under the BJP-led government and directed officials to submit a detailed report on the functioning of Mohalla Clinics. Singh, who has been allocated the health, transport, and information technology portfolios, took oath on Wednesday along with five other cabinet ministers in the newly formed Rekha Gupta government.

"Public transport will remain free as promised. We are committed to improving facilities further," Singh said. He assured that free public transport for women will not be discontinued and said that the government plans to improve introduce new benefits in public transport. Singh, a 48-year-old debutant legislator and a prominent Purvanchali face in the new government, is a dental surgeon-turned-politician. Speaking about the Mohalla Clinics, Singh said, he has asked the Health Secretary to submit a report detailing their operations, including the total number of functional clinics, staffing, property ownership status, and the frequency of doctor visits. The minister said that he has

also inquired about clinics where doctors do not visit but bills are still being generated. He further claimed that, according to his assessment, 30 to 40 percent of Mohalla Clinics do not even open regularly.

Addressing the shortage of the clinics, he said inspections will be conducted, and necessary actions will be taken based on the results. He assured that visible changes will take place within 100 days.

Singh also sought a comprehensive report on pending healthcare projects, which is expected by February 27, following which further steps will be taken. On the Ayushman Bharat health insurance scheme, he said, "We had sent the Ayushman Bharat file to the Centre. Now that it has returned, we will make all efforts to implement it by next week."

As a doctor himself, Singh stressed the importance of understanding the challenges faced by medical professionals and pledged to address their concerns. He also highlighted the government's focus on essential services like water supply and sewage management. "Discussions are underway to ensure Delhi residents get clean drinking water and air. People should not face shortages during summer," he said, adding that significant

improvements will be visible in the next winter season.

Ashish Sood, who has been given the Home, Power, Urban Development, Education, Higher Education, Training and Technical Education, said the AAP deliberately did not implement the Ayushman Bharat scheme in Delhi and denied the people of the city its benefits.

The minister said the Ayushman Bharat scheme, a key initiative of the central government, was approved in the first Cabinet meeting on Thursday. "Now, people of Delhi will also have the opportunity to avail its benefits," he said.

He informed that the Delhi government will also sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the central government and ensure its full-scale implementation, the minister said.

Delhi's Social Welfare, SC & ST Welfare, Elections and Cooperative Minister Ravinder Indraj Singh said that he would prioritise the development of rural areas as a minister. Singh who got the social welfare, SC & ST welfare, cooperative and elections departments in the Delhi government said he understands the challenges ahead.

"Having lived here, I know the issues firsthand. Development will be prioritised," he said.

They said that many state-run hospitals have been facing an acute shortage of medical superintendents (MS) and medical directors (MD), with some officials managing two hospitals simultaneously, which affects the functioning of health facilities.

Addressing this issue is a priority, he said, adding that the government is expected to take steps to prevent disruptions in medical services and ensure that people continue to receive essential healthcare facilities without any hindrance.

Along with that, the Health Information Management System (HIMS) and the enforcement of the Clinical Establishments Act will also be reviewed, a health official said.

"For the past year, we have been highlighting gaps in the health sector. Now that all departments have been directed to prepare a blueprint for the first 100 days of work, some key proposals are under consideration," the official added.

He said that HIMS has been a long-

standing demand of the Delhi government.

"This system is a fundamental requirement for hospital management, and its implementation will significantly improve healthcare services," he said.

HIMS, which is free of cost and helps curb corruption, is a government-to-government (G2G) web-based Monitoring Information System launched by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) in October 2008.

It aims to provide key inputs for policy formulation and programme interventions but was not approved by the AAP government.

Meanwhile, the Clinical Establishments (Registration and Regulation) Act, 2010, enacted by the central government, mandates the registration and regulation of all clinical establishments in the country to ensure minimum standards of facilities and services.

The newly formed Delhi Cabinet approved the implementation of the Ayushman Bharat health insurance scheme in the capital during the first session of the eighth Assembly.

Following the approval of the scheme, other key measures—such as restructuring Mohalla clinics for better efficiency—may be the next steps towards building a better healthcare system in Delhi. Mohalla clinics will not be shut down, as public welfare should not be compromised.

The National Health Authority (NHA) has begun

preparations for the rollout, including training Delhi's health officials, personnel, and ASHA workers to create Ayushman Bharat cards, settle claims, and register hospitals.

According to the Joint Secretary and Mission Director (ABDM) of the National Health Authority, Kiran Gopal Vaska,

"The National Health Authority has already started to ensure the preparations for onboarding. So there are various steps in this. The first one is about preparation for the MOU signing, where the Delhi government and NHA will sign an MOU for implementing this scheme." The Delhi govern-

ment, led by Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, has committed to implementing the scheme, which is expected to benefit millions of residents.

The scheme aims to provide health coverage of up to Rs 10 lakh to 6.54 lakh families in Delhi, including 70 plus old-age beneficiaries, 1500

Anganwadi workers, and 6000 Aasha workers. After making the necessary changes, the Delhi government will finalize the list of beneficiaries.

Delhi's health officials, personnel, and ASHA workers are being trained to create Ayushman Bharat cards, settle claims, and register hospi-

tals.

"There is a lot of training right from field-level workers, and then claim settlement processing, pre-authorization, request, administrative formalities, etc," said Vaska.

Notably, 66 hospitals in Delhi, including private and government hospitals, are

already empanelled under the Ayushman Bharat Yojana Scheme. After the formation of district committees and the State Health Agency, more hospitals will be added to the list. On hospitals empanelled under the Ayushman Bharat Yojana Scheme, Vaska said, "66 hospitals in Delhi are

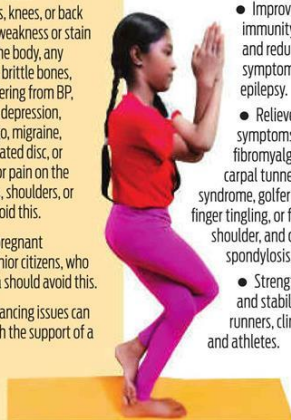
