It's a conundrum for every brand – the marketing landscape in the era of AI. **Prasad Sangameshwaran** and **Glynda Alves** speak to 25 leading marketers and evangelists to sketch out a blueprint for 2025



Amit Doshi, CMO, Britannia Industries: Consumers can feel overwhelmed by information overload. Marketing teams need to think of their job as the total customer experience, which delivers trusted brands and strong business results. Marketers will be compelled to have a bias for 'simplicity' in brand thinking and 'synthesis' of brand actions across the company.

Shiv Shivakumar, operating partner, Advent International: As consumers get more impulsive and impatient, time as an element in marketing and its role in every business model will amplify. We urgently need to find out what makes our deported migrants so desperate to leave the country

As planeloads of our deported migrants land in the country a number of questions are being asked. Why are they handcuffed? Why are all the planes landing in Amritsar?

But the most important question has yet to be raised, let alone answered. Why did they risk and lose their life savings, and in some cases even their lives, in such do-or-die attempts to get out of our country, the world's fastest-growing major economy and the world's most populous democracy boasting a global soft power outreach from yoga and Ayurveda to Bollywood and bhangra rap?

Incredible India is indeed incredible. And one of the more incredible things about it is that so many of its citizens will go to such dire lengths to get out of it, legally or otherwise. The wealthy do so by acquiring qualifications that will enable them to become foreign citizens. The poor, or the not-so-wealthy, try to do so through the dangerous route of illegal migration.

However, most of the deportees are from states like Punjab, Haryana, and Gujarat, billed as being among the most prosperous in the country. Many of the deportees reportedly paid agents sizeable sums, enough to start a small business or provide other means of self-employment.

High selenium levels in wheat not yet proven as culprit in Buldhana

High selenium levels in wheat not yet proven as culprit in Buldhana

New Delhi: Govt Tuesday said there is no conclusive proof yet on cause of abrupt baldness in many people in Maharashtra's Buldhana.

Though some local experts have pointed to the role of high levels of selenium — a chemical element and essential mineral — found in samples of wheat sourced from Punjab, being supplied through rations shops, govt sources said Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has taken samples of several other food items to identify the reason behind the unusual health crisis.

Sources in the food ministry said there has been "no such report from any other state". Punjab is the biggest contributor to the central pool of wheat managed by Food Corporation of India (FCI), followed by Haryana

and Madhya Pradesh. In the last rabi season, 128 lakh tonnes of wheat was procured from Punjab, which was around 47% of the total purchase for the central pool.

Govt distributes free wheat from this stock under PDS to beneficiaries under the PM Garib Kalyan Ann Yojna. Importantly, junior health minister Prataprao Jadhav, who also holds the

AYUSH portfolio, is an MP from Buldhana. Jadhav told **TOI** that he has been following up on the issue since reports of abrupt and widespread baldness emerged from Buldhana. "Presently, the situation is under control," he said.

He said ICMR and several other state and central agencies are monitoring the situation and at the same time working to identify the cause. "Selenium is found in many food items, not just wheat. It is true that some samples of wheat have been found positive for high levels of the chemical element. However, it is too early to attribute abrupt baldness in the region to it. There are other food items that are being investigated as well," Jadhav said.

The role of contaminated water and nutritional deficiencies are also being investigated, sources said.

STEPS

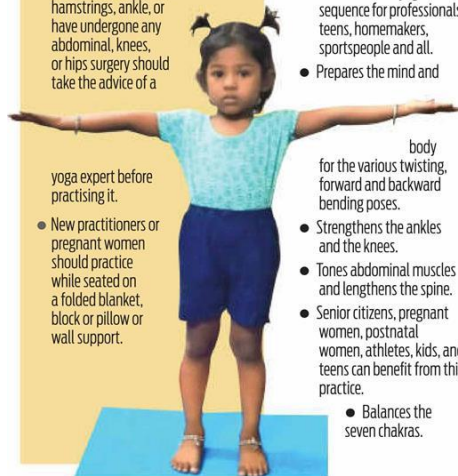
- Start in Tadasana Variation Feet Hip Wide.
- Roll the shoulders back. Take a few deep breaths here. Relax, balance body weight equally on your feet.
- Inhale, lift your arms. Keep them parallel to the floor with palms facing upward.
- Feel a gentle external shoulder rotation as the palms turn upward.
- Keep your shoulders relaxed, allowing the shoulder blades to slide back, creating space between the ears and shoulders.
- Ground your feet. Stay here for about six breaths or as per the body's capacity.
- Slowly release and return to the original position. Take a moment to notice the effects of the pose on your energy and state of mind.
- Finally, relax in Tadasana Palms Facing Forward while taking deep breaths.

22nd EGM: IREDA Shareholders Approve up to ₹5,000 Crore Fundraising via QIP



Shareholders of Indian Renewable Energy Development Agency Ltd. (IREDA) have approved the company's proposal to raise up to ₹5,000 crore through Qualified Institutions Placement (QIP) of equity shares, in one or multiple tranches. The approval was granted by the shareholders in favour of the resolution via remote e-voting during the 22nd Extra-Ordinary General Meeting (EGM) held today through video conferencing. The meeting was chaired by Shri Pradip Kumar Das, Chairman and Managing Director, IREDA and attended by Directors on the Board and shareholders. IREDA's Board had earlier approved the fundraising plan on January 23, 2025, which includes the dilution of the Government of India's shareholding in the company by up to 7% post-issue equity, in one or multiple tranches.

TADASANA STRETCHED OUT HANDS (MOUNTAIN POSE STRETCHED OUT HANDS)

It is commonly practised to stretch and open the shoulders, chest, upper back, side torso, and arms, strengthening them. It strengthens the deltoids, rotator cuff muscles, and scapular stabilisers. Furthermore, extending the arms sideways engages the core muscles, including the rectus abdominis, obliques, and transverse abdominis.

STEPS

- Start in Tadasana Variation Feet Hip Wide.
- Roll the shoulders back. Take a few deep breaths here. Relax, and balance body weight equally on your feet.
- Inhale and lift your arms. Keep them parallel to the floor with palms facing upward.
- Feel a gentle external shoulder rotation as the palms turn upward.
- Keep your shoulders relaxed, allowing the shoulder blades to slide back, creating space between the ears and shoulders.
- Ground your feet. Stay here for six breaths.
- Slowly release and return to the original position. Take a moment to notice the effects of the pose on your energy and state of mind.
- Finally, relax in Tadasana Palms Facing Forward while taking deep breaths.

BENEFITS

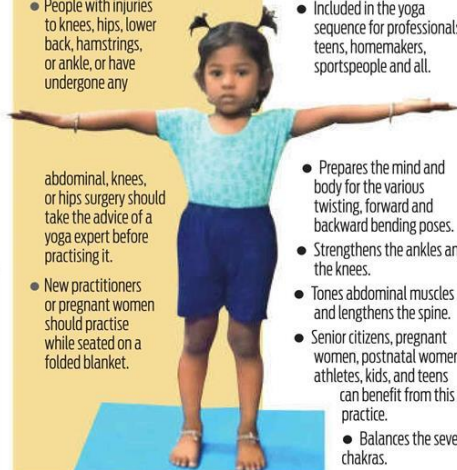
- Reduces lower back, neck, and shoulder tension.
- Included as a warm-up pose in therapeutic and restorative yoga.
- Engages the muscles around the shoulders.
- Improves overall coordination, making it easier to perform arm and shoulder activities.

- Helps kids and teens keep calm, steady, and capable of accessing their thoughtful brain.
- Improves breathing and impacts stability and balance.
- Aids to achieve a mind-body connection.
- Avoids slouched or hunched back.
- Increases the blood supply to the digestive and reproductive systems.
- Facilitates meditation and pranayama sessions.
- Included in the yoga sequence for professionals, teens, homemakers, sportspeople and all.

LIMITATIONS

- People with arthritis in the knees, hips, and feet, or senior citizens suffering from sciatica, BP, slipped disc, spinal issues, weak digestion, backache, or knee pain, avoid this practice.
- People with injuries to knees, hips, lower back, hamstrings, or ankle, or have undergone any

abdominal, knees, or hips surgery should take the advice of a yoga expert before practising it.

- New practitioners or pregnant women should practise while seated on a folded blanket.



- Prepares the mind and body for the various twisting, forward and backward bending poses.
- Strengthens the ankles and the knees.
- Tones abdominal muscles and lengthens the spine.
- Senior citizens, pregnant women, postnatal women, athletes, kids, and teens can benefit from this practice.
- Balances the seven chakras.
